GENERAL ELSLEY FOR SIBERIA

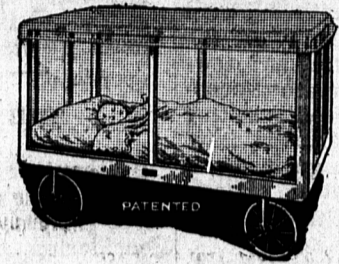

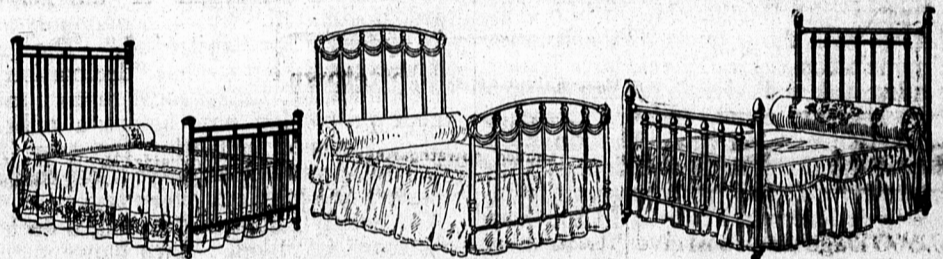
