### A CENTRAL STATION

Well Equipped With Cold Storage Facilities

FOR N.B., N.S. AND P.E.I.

Would Stimulate the Producers and the Output Would be Increased.

It is manifestly desirable that every possible opportunity in the development of our provincial butter and cheese making should be taken advantage of whenever it appears. All three provinces are progressing rapidly in the building up of a valuable trade on these lines and so far as it goes this is a highly satisfactory state of affairs. Most of our readers are aware of the position which Montreal occupies in relation to the industry in the provinces of Quebec and Ontario. It has become one of the chief exporting points in the Dominion and the result is that it enjoys a volume of business in these goods which is no small factor in the annual traffic of the port. The dairying industry of the Maritime Provinces is in need of some such concentration of output and the sooner it is undertaken the better will be our chance of getting a share of the growing trade. We cannot hope for the attainment of a full measure of success in these undertakings until we have established at Halifax a central depot well equipped with cold storage facilities, where the manufactured stock from various parts of the three provinces could be received and held for convenient shipment to the chief consuming market of Europe. As

at present constituted, our provincial butter and cheese factories are individually conducted on too small a scale and the result is, that the cost of production is higher than it should be and we are therefore shut out of profitable export markets. By establishing such a central station we would be in a position to invite the shipment of relatively small parcels of butter and cheese from producing points which when up to a uniform grade of quality and color could be offered en bloc to large buyers for export. This would have the ultimate result of placing Halifax in relation to the rest of the Maritime Provinces in the position which Montreal occupies with respect to the agricultural district of Quebec and Ontario. Another effect of this arrangement would be to increase the capacities of the various creameries and cheese factories which are increasing with such rapidity throughout Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia. The many advantages which would be offered these industries by reason of the existence of such a central station would soon stimulate the producers to such an extent that the aggregate output would be materially increased with profit to themselves and their districts as well as a valuable addition to the city of Halifax in the shape of becoming what she is richly entitled to, namely, that of being chief exporting points.—Maritime Merchant.

### PAPER MADE FROM PEAT.

A Large Mill for this Purpose will be built Here.

MONTREAL, Oct. 25.—Peat instead of spruce wood for paper pulp is expected to revolutionize the paper industry in the Dominion.

Mr. Charles Lionais, the well-known civil and mining engineer, who has been for the last four months visiting the principal pulp mills of the United States, has purchased the patent process of producing fibrous material from peat. Already there are in operation several factories in Europe which are producing large quantities of all kinds of paper from this material, and which have proved highly profitable. From a national economical standpoint this invention will be of great value, as it will be the means of developing a new field of industry, and lands and territories formerly worthless are now becoming valuable.
