## Canadian Whiskey Smugglers Caught

BOSTON, Dec. 20.—Louis Weinraub, a member of the Union Wool Stock Company of Montreal, Canada, was arraigned before United States Commissioner Hayes yesterday morning following his arrest near the North Station, on the charge of violation of the revenue act in making false invoices on goods shipped from Montreal to this country. He was held in \$5,000. Two freight cars were held up at Richford, Vt., Saturday, according to the officials, which contained several hundred cases of whiskey gin and brandy. They were shipped from Montreal and consigned to parties in Hartford, Conn. The liquor is the biggest seizure of a foreign importation taken in by the government and is valued at \$15,000 according to foreign valuation.

## U. S. Irish Women In Demonstration

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 20.—When the British Ambassador to the United States arrived at a hotel here last night, where he is scheduled to speak at the New England Society dinner, he was greeted by 150 placards telling of alleged conditions in Ireland during the occupancy of the Black and Tans on pastboard banners, carried by women describing themselves as American citizens. As the Ambassador stepped from an automobile he was forced to make his way through a slowly marching column of Irish sympathizers who failed to recognize him as he mounted the steps. Several women members of the Irish Relief Society, under whose auspices the demonstration was held, solicited him for money. A pedestrian who had taken a placard from one of the women and hurled it into the street was overtaken by the policeman and forced to apologize to the society.

## IN MEMORIAM

MRS. ALEXANDER McDONALD

There entered into rest prepared for the people of God on December the first at Bellevue, Christy Cameron, wife of the late Alexander McDonald.

Mrs. McDonald was born at Cameron's Isle, Point Prim on July 12th, 1834. She was one of a family of ten children of whom two survive her, Capt. Alex Cameron of Charlottetown and Mrs. Allen McDonald of Pinette. She was married on the 17th, of March 1864. A family of nine children were born to this union all of whom survive her viz:—Dr. A. C. of Warsaw, Indiana; (Christy), Mrs. A. J. McLeod, Kinross; Alex. B. Butte, Ontario; John C. of Point Prim; (Annie), Mrs. J. A. Gillis, Kinross; (Catherine), Mrs. J. A. McDonald and Donald of Culbertson, Montana and Roderick C., in the old home with whom she lived, and from whom she received the most unselfish kindness till the last. This family, also (Flora) Mrs. Eagles of Boston, a step daughter who loved her as her very own.

She was a woman who began life with her husband in pioneer days. But with supreme courage, and an optimism that remained with her through the years, she radiated good cheer, and inspired both husband and children towards successful careers.

She was a living exponent of Christian hospitality and true neighbourliness.

Intensely active and alert physically, she was about almost to the last, although her memory was impaired. But on the evening of December the first she fell asleep, "Blessed sleep from which no one wakes to weep."

Rev. J. A. McLellan, Valleyfield, where she was a member for many years conducted the funeral service in the home, assisted by Rev. Dr. McEwen of Orwell. The interment was in Valleyfield Cemetery beside her husband.

JOHN HARPER

Death claimed one of the oldest residents of Tignish Parish on Nov 30 when John Harper passed to his reward. He had reached the advanced age of 90, but was hale and hearty until a couple of months previous to his death.

Mr. Harper was a pioneer settler of Tignish Parish and one of the last of a generation that has almost entirely passed away. When he first established his mill where it now stands, Western Princes was little more than a wilderness. Stories abound of the hospitality shown all comers in these early days by him and his kind hearted spouse, who died five years ago.

It can truly be said of him that he didn't have an enemy in the world. His willingness at all times to help a neighbor in need and his kindly disposition made him

respected and esteemed by all. Interment took place on Dec. 2. Father McDougall conducting the services both in the church and at the grave.
