though the Provincial Government accounts must be forwarded monthly to the Department of Labor at Ottawa. Three months of the period covered by the bill are in the closed fiscal year of the Federal Government.

Coupled with His Worship's contention at City Council meetings that the provincial government had shirked responsibility in reimbursing the City for expenditures covered in the bill above referred to, was the further contention that the Government itself was doing nothing in the way of relieving unemployment distress in Charlottetown. The fact is that while the City was expending \$159.12 in seven months, or \$22.78 per month for direct civil relief, the Government, for the same period and for the same purpose, was expending \$2,989.95, or over \$382.42 per month.

As already stated, the failure of the civic authorities to notify the Government of the payments it was making resulted in an overlapping of disbursements which could have been avoided.

A further interesting comparison of civic relief expenditures is afforded by the Civic Reports. They show that in 1931 the City expended \$382.69 for "groceries to poor, and coal." This year, up to August, according to the bill in dispute, the disbursements by the city were \$159.12.
