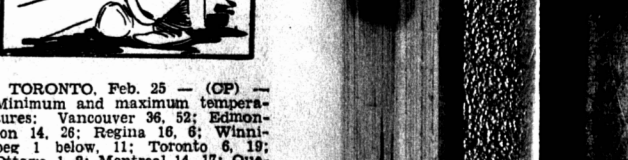
3,500 Barrels Of Seed Potatoes Lost In Fire
