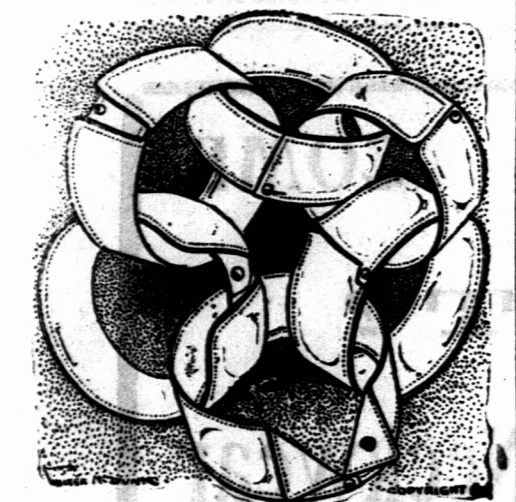

N. J. LOCKHART, M.A., LL. B. of Pownal, P. E. I., was recently admitted as a Barrister and Solicitor of the Supreme Court of Nova Scotia. He will practice with W. Crowe, Mayor of Sydney, Cape Breton. Mr. Lockhart is step-son of Rev. J. C. Spurr of Pownal.
WORD was received in Souris yesterday from East Boston announcing the death in that place of Solomon Bateman, a former resident of Souris. [No particulars of the death are given. Mr. Bateman who was over 55 years of age, has resided in Boston for over five years. He leaves a widow and one daughter, Mrs. John R. McIvor, now resident in Souris.

ALEXANDER Stanton of East Boston writing to the Guardian says:—"We read in your paper of Oct. 29 that the body of Martin Stanton who was murdered in the Maine woods was sent to Mr. McIntyre of Central House Bangor for interment. This statement is true but Mr. McIntyre telegraphed to his brother in East Boston who claimed the remains. Mr. McIntyre then kindly forwarded the body here and interment was made in Holy Cross Cemetery, Malden Mass.
At the Police Court yesterday five boys Lemuel Mill, Edmund Myers, Joseph Shepherd, Robert Stanley, and John Shepherd before the Magistrate charged with disorderly conduct on the streets were each fined \$5 or 30 days. Joseph Shepherd the man who backed his car of coal through the window of W. A. Hutchison's store a few days ago was fined \$1 and costs for driving a horse and cart on the sidewalk. The prohibition case against George Offer was dismissed the witness swearing that he bought only beer. A man named Alexander McDonald professing to be from Souris was remained till the 14th for vagrancy.

A VERY marked interest is being taken throughout the three Maritime Provinces in the Water Fair to be held at Amherst, N. S. on the 16th, 17th and 18th December next. Exhibits are coming from all parts of New Brunswick and Nova Scotia, and a number of enquiries have been received from Prince Edward Island breeders and feeders. That there will be a large attendance is evidenced by the way in which excursions are being arranged from different centres. From Kentville alone an excursion of one-hundred and fifty will attend. This Show will not only be a great educational convention, but it will be a splendid advertising medium for all breeders and feeders who will exhibit. Island farmers are generally alive to this fact, and they will not willingly miss this great opportunity.

Gears are substituted for belts, thus doing away with the great amount of slippage which was always such a source of trouble with the old-style machines. It was with this machine that all records were broken by Ted Hanson, of New York, who clipped a horse complete in 14 minutes, which was a most wonderful performance, and which was not possible with the old fashioned machine.
