The annual meeting for the discussion of civic affairs was held Thursday night in the Market Hall, Summerside. J. E. Wyatt was appointed chairman. Mayor Saunders in a concise yet comprehensive address reviewed the past year's work and spoke at some length upon the financial engineering into which the town has lately become involved on account of the Waterworks Sewerage system. In spite of the strongest money conditions at the present day the town was able to get its money at five per cent on temporary loans to be held if required till money conditions became better. He also elaborated an estimate of the next year's business showing the total expenditure would approximate \$15,000. Several citizens addressed the meeting in general approval of the Council's administration.

When the president rose to announce the opening of the meeting the great audience became perfectly still and the very best of order and attention were given during the exercises. Singing gospel hymns, reading scripture selections and offering prayer constituted the opening exercises after which an excellent program was most splendidly rendered. The pledge is read at every meeting and the opportunity given to any who desire to sign the same. The speeches are always strong, fearless, instructive and convincing. A sharp look-out is kept upon the prohibition officials as well as upon the offenders of the law. This society aims at gathering within its fold all the young people and each member to become a temperance missionary. In this way they hope to greatly help a better enforcement of the prohibitory law. Between the two societies at Springfield, Lot eight, and at Cape Wolfe there is a membership of over two

hundred and fifty. As during the past two years, so in still larger measures, they hope in the future to be a terror to rum-sellers.

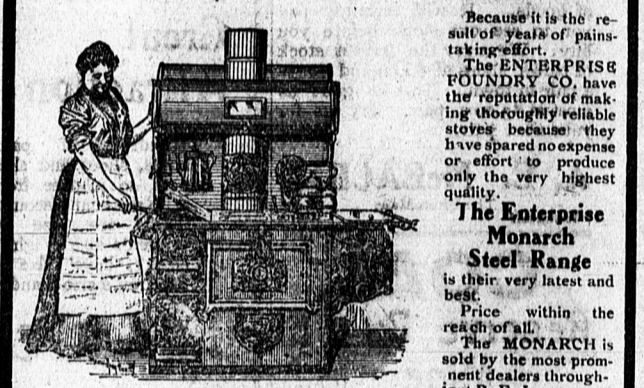
