## EQUIPMENT FOR WINTER FOR EUROPEAN TROOPS

NEW YORK, N. Y., Nov. 24.--Agents for the British and French governments announced here today that they were in the market for 1,350,000 wool sweaters; 600,000 wool stomach bands, 1,600,000 wool gloves and 500,000 pairs of wool socks.

In order to determine where such an enormous quantity of woolen goods might be purchased quickly, an advertisement was placed in a commercial newspaper. It was said that the goods were required for prompt delivery, that orders would be made in cash for goods delivered in New York.

The wholesale value of the goods wanted is more than \$2,000,000.

### HOT POTATO CAKES FOR TEA.

Potato cakes, nicely made and served hot, are delicious for tea. Six medium-sized potatoes and two pounds of flour will make a pile big enough for a hungry little family of six or more.

Peel and boil the potatoes. Mash them fine with a fork, or, if you have one, put them through a potato squeezer. This instrument forces the vegetables through perforations and reduces them quickly to meal. This if the potatoes are not of a very dry kind may be rather soapy, and too moist. When this is the case it should be placed on the back of the range for five or ten minutes. Season it with salt, and add half a teaspoonful of baking powder. Then work in the flour forming a stiff dough. If necessary a little milk may be required, but use care, for it may not be needed at all.

The potato meal, with its natural moisture, is generally able to take up and bind the flour, and the dough should finally be firm and dry. Roll out thin, cut into any desired shape, and bake on a gridiron or ovenplate. When they are baked, take them out of the oven, split each cake, open in two, spread on plenty of butter, place the halves together again, cut the cakes placed in a pile, into quarters and serve.

## BRITISH MINE FIELD EXTENDED

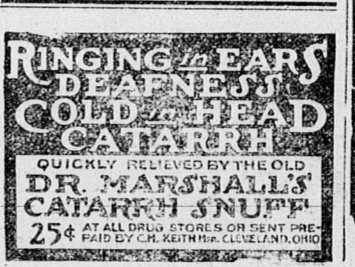
