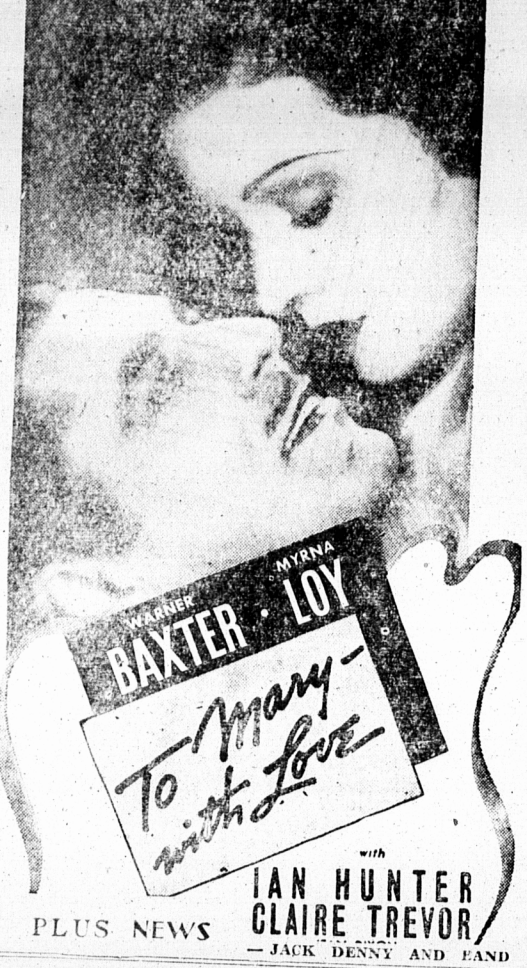

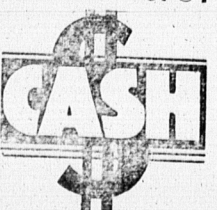

Blames Shipwreck On Mistaken Light

HAMILTON, Bermuda, Oct. 31—(CP cable)—Testifying before a Court of Inquiry today, Captain Crescencio Narvaro of the stranded Spanish liner Cristobal Colon said he had mistaken "some" light for the North Rock beacon.
He had received no directions for navigating from shore, he said, and had not seen any danger signals. The ship's position had been correct from sights taken a few hours before her grounding, the captain added.
The 10,833-ton liner ended her odyssey early Sunday piling up on the treacherous reef without warning. Previously she sailed from Cardiff, Wales, for an unknown Mexican destination after wandering about the Atlantic for weeks, unable to call at Spain because of the civil war.
Attempts to refloat her have been unsuccessful.
