COMMON AND IDEAL FARMING.

A rather striking table appeared in a recent issue of the Montreal Star showing the yield and value of crops per acre as produced on the Macdonald College Farm, compared with the average yield and value produced on the farms throughout the Dominion.

In the Dominion produce such results as those at Macdonald College. There is excellent land to begin with. It is safe to say that the average of tilled farm lands in Canada is not nearly so good.

Another table shows the value of the hay, clover, barley, roots and corn crop of Canada for the past year to have been \$318,822,300, while if these crops had been as good throughout as on the College Farm they would have been worth \$689,390,000, or more than twice the value actually produced.

We are not told at what cost the big crops at the College were produced, and this is important to know, for unless ideal farming can be made to pay it might as well be left alone.

VICE IN WINNIPEG.

Our readers will remember that some months ago the Toronto newspapers published certain charges made by Rev. Dr. Shearer as to the prevalence of vice in Winnipeg and the connection of the police authorities therewith.

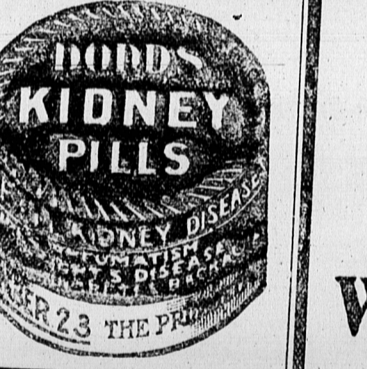
The known facts in regard to the reciprocity negotiations appear to be that after a strenuous conference of fourteen days an agreement has been reached providing for a freer exchange of certain products of the two countries than has hitherto existed.

Dr. Shearer charged that "two years ago they had no vice district in Winnipeg. One year ago they had twenty-nine houses in a restricted area. Now they have fifty-three houses with probably 250 inmates. Everyone of these criminal dens is also an illicit liquor dive."

As to the negotiations, it seems to be assumed that what the Canadian Ministers labored to secure was the admission of Canadian farm products and to a certain extent all our natural products, to the American market on more favorable terms than hitherto.

The public accounts of British Columbia for the last fiscal year make a truly remarkable showing, with receipts of \$8,874,741, an expenditure of \$6,382,993, and a surplus of almost \$2,250,000.

Two of the larger items which go to make up the year's revenue are, land sales \$2,618,188, and timber licenses \$1,928,901, while timber royalties added \$305,198.
