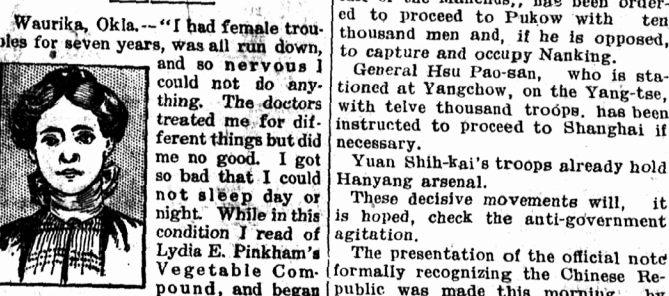

OF SPECIAL INTEREST
