Decorations Should be Simple This Year



The Christmas dinner table pictured here has the festive appearance the season calls for, but it has been achieved with very little outlay which is important when money is needed for the war effort. This year money that would normally be spent on special Christmas decorations should be put into war savings. Trail red candles of varying lengths (some of them saved from last year) were grouped in the center of the table, the flat holders concealed by a base of cedar twigs decorated with silvered pine cones. The little candlestick place cards were home made. A Job Only You Can Do Price Control Questions And Answers

Questions and answers on Price Control will appear in The Guardian as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board. Readers who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, Chappell Building, Charlottetown.

Q. I have four ration books for adults how much tea should I get a month?

A. You would be allowed one pound of tea every four weeks.

Q. Is there a price ceiling on extra large eggs?

A. According to order 178, any set of mixed one ounce of tea may charge quality premiums for such eggs; provided that such premiums do not exceed the premiums charged for similar eggs during the basic period (Sept. 15 to Oct. 11) 1941. If he did not sell quality premium eggs during the basic period, the price in excess of the minimum must not exceed the premium charged during the basic period by his nearest comparable competitor in his locality.

Q. Are we allowed one ounce of tea a week or two ounces?

A. Each adult holder of a ration book is allowed one ounce of tea a week. You may not purchase a month's supply at one time.

Q. Can a hotel increase its rates for Christmas celebrations?

A. No. Admissions prices for Christmas and New Year's entertainment offered by restaurants, hotels, etc., must not be increased above the rates for similar occasions a year ago.

Q. I am a farm woman and expect to buy a fur hat as I have to walk a mile into town each day. Is it now against the regulations to get a fur hat?

A. The order does not affect the making of fur hats when used for warmth. The purpose of the new clothing regulations is not to do away with any essential use of furs, but to eliminate its use as a "fill" in the reason for the order is to save vital manpower.

Q. I have three pounds of butter in my refrigerator and I believe it is going rancid. What should I do about it?

A. Butter goes rancid when it is kept at a temperature of 20 degrees or lower until a few days before it is to be used. It should be removed when the butter is rancid. The reason why butter will not rancid in your home refrigerator is because the temperature is not as cold as in the plant. Butter will not rancid if it is kept fresh longer than about three weeks after it has left storage. If you do not use your butter until it goes off, you may find it will go off for you. We would advise you to buy only the butter needed for immediate use.

Q. I understand that all fish do not come under the ceiling price but don't you think fish is lobster is pretty high from 38c a week ago and 29c last year at this time?

A. As lobster is not under the price ceiling, there is no regulation at present to prevent increase in price.

THE COOK'S CORNER

CANDY FRUIT ROLL

One cup sugar, 3-4 cup milk, 1 lb. butter, cook these three together to soft-ball stage. Add 1 cup dates cut in small pieces. Roll into 10 minutes more, stirring constantly. Stir in 1 cup coconut, 1 cup walnut pieces. Cool. Put in wet cloth and roll into roll 1 inch or more thick. Leave several hours, roll in powdered sugar. Cut in slices.

SCOTCH SHORTBREADS

One cup butter 1-2 cup confectioners' sugar, 2 cups bread flour, 1-4 teaspoon baking powder, 1-4 teaspoon salt. Mash butter, add sugar gradually and flour sifted with baking powder and salt. Roll, shape and decorate with peel or cherries and bake at 350 degrees F. for 20 or 30 minutes until delicately browned.

MAKE GOOD BROWN GRAVY

Who doesn't like rich brown gravy to flavor potatoes and rice at the dinner table? And what cook doesn't have difficulty in making plenty of gravy from steak, chops and chicken broiled in the oven? So here is one trick that will help you get abundant, tasty gravy to go with broiled meats.

MAKE GOOD BROWN GRAVY

When cooking steak or chops allow an onion in thick pieces to put in the dripping pan under the meat. If the onion is cut too thin it will burn and ruin the gravy. Just before the meat is done, slowly brown a tablespoon of flour in a heavy iron skillet. Turn into the onion and all the juices that have dripped from the meat. Blend carefully without burning and add enough water to make gravy of the desired thickness. Season to taste and serve at once.

MAKE GOOD BROWN GRAVY

For broiled chicken omit the onion and substitute the shiblets that have been cut into small pieces.
