Stocks Close Lower After Mild Rally

NEW YORK, March 4 — Stocks
enjoyed a mild rally in today's
early market proceeding only to be
thrown for a loss in the closing
hour.
Steels, motors, coppers and spec-
ialties led the morning recovery for
advances running to a point or so.
Declines of as much among these
groups were in the majority at the
sound of the final gong.
Transfers totalled 488,930 shares
compared with 466,880 yesterday.
The week's turnover thus far was
the lowest in about three years.
The Associated Press average of 50 stocks
was off 3 of a point at 44.8.
General Electric was improved
the greater part of the day despite
a reduction of the dividend. The
stock was down 5-8 of a point at
the close.

WINNIPEG, March 3 — (CP)—
May wheat collapsed to its lowest
level since Jan. 4 as futures fell
nearly four cents in the most stir-
ring session on Winnipeg grain
exchange in several weeks.
Barley and oats held comparat-
ively steady in coarse grain trading
on purchases credited to exporters
and eastern mills. Barley closed
7-8 lower, oats 5-8 lower, flax 1-
7-8 lower and rye 1 3-4-2 1-4 cents
down.
General liquidation by tired
longs resulted from forecast of
moisture in the United States
southwest and absence of foreign
buying in North American wheat.
All wheat futures reached lows un-
touched since February, closing 3
1-2-2 cents lower, May at 1.22 5-8,
July 1.14 1-2-5-8 and Oct 94 1-8-
1-4 cents.
Cash wheat dealings continue
on a small-time basis with Nos. 1
and 2 northern unchanged, 15 and
7 cents higher than the May fur-
ture.
