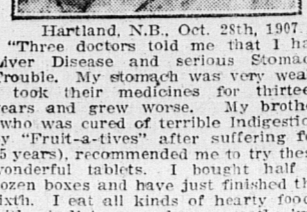

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., April 22.—Mme. Lillian Nordica, and other relatives of Mrs. Vannie F. Allen, of Malden, who were not mentioned in the latter's will, were defeated in the Middlesex Probate Court yesterday in the effort to break the will, but Judge McIntyre, who admitted the instrument to probate announced that an appeal could be taken to the Supreme Court, and a jury trial obtained on the question of undue influence. 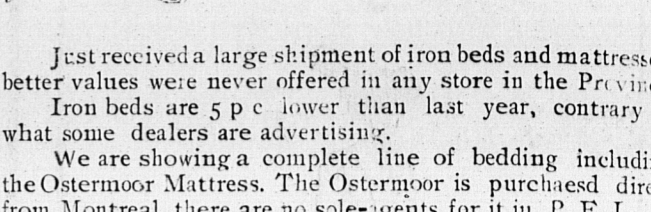
