HONOR PASTOR

On Departure to Another Section of Province

Rev. Edwin Smith M. A., Kensington, is Remembered by His Different Congregations.

During the past week Rev. Edwin Smith M. A., the popular pastor at Kensington has been the recipient of marks of loving esteem from different sections of his congregation.

On Saturday Nov. 29, the Irishtown congregation presented him with an address and purse; on Wednesday afternoon last Long River met at the Manse and gave another address with a purse, and on Wednesday evening the Kensington church made their departing pastor the recipient of the following address accompanied by a purse and set of silver mounted harness.

Rev. Edwin Smith M. A. DEAR FRIEND,—As your decision to accept a call to another field of labor necessitates your removal from our midst we wish to thus express our good will towards you, and our appreciation of the work done here, both as a minister of the Gospel and as a citizen.

Although you began your work here under difficulties not easily overcome, and of a nature to hinder its success, yet you leave the congregation almost free from all financial encumbrances and with comfortable churches, in good state of repair, and with a comfortable manse. All the sobornes of the church have been well supported and the condition of the congregation is such that the marked progress made during your pastorate should continue. Your pulpit efforts were well sustained, tolerant to all but faithful to truth.

Your work as pastor was cheering and sympathetic, the sick receiving your special attention.

In the community you have made friends steadily. It is inevitable that an active progressive man will often be misunderstood and his motives questioned but in the end he gets his vindication. Such has been your case and all have come to know you better as "the mists have rolled away."

We regret your leaving us—we regret parting with your estimable partner Mrs. Smith and your interesting promising family.

We ask you to accept the accompanying gifts as a mark of appreciation and esteem.

In conclusion we trust that you may be long spared in health and strength to labour in the Master's cause, and that your efforts may be abundantly blessed.

The occasion again reminds us that "friend after friend departs" and that this is a place of partings, some for short, some for longer periods and some that are final, and as "Heaven from all creatures hides the book of fate" we know not what ours is but we hope at least to meet though not so frequently as has been our privilege yet again. However our relationship has been pleasant and the memory of it will be ever green.
