cabins but bodies were thrown into the plane which exploded. Pieces of wreckage were scattered more than 100 yards in the snow-covered field.

Some of the wreckage was being examined by a team of men with wounds still in the first stage of healing.

It was asserted, too, that in some areas the enemy was burning his dead; was using gunners as engineers; and headquarters guards as ordinary infantry.

all military, but a limited amount of civilian needs, including automobile tires.

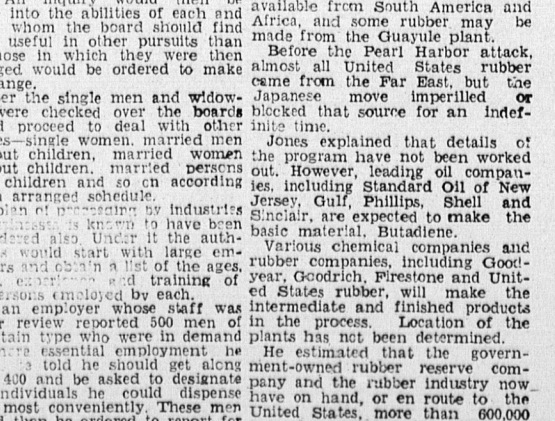
What large the program was could be judged from the fact that all the synthetic rubber plants now in operation or under construction in the United States have a total capacity of 90,000 tons a year.
