We quote wholesale prices as follows: Turkeys, per lb. 48c to 50c Chickens..... 35c to 40c Fowl..... 30c to 32c Roosters..... 28c to 32c Ducks..... 30c to 32c There was no change in the condition of the market for potatoes today, prices being firm under a good, steady demand for supplies, and fairly active trade was done with sales of car lots of Quebec sound stock at \$1.85 to \$1.90 per bag of 30 lbs. ex-track, and Green Mountains were quoted at \$2.11 a wholesale jobbing way Quebecs are selling at \$2.25 per bag of 30 lbs. ex-store.

The receipts of butter today were 1,673 boxes as compared with 1,786 for the same day last week, and 2,283 for the corresponding day a year ago. The market today was quiet owing to the fact that few orders were received from over the cable and according to advices English importers are not disposed to operate freely with the British markets in their present condition, consequently the prospects are not very encouraging for the future.
