# NEW SCHEME TO STOP JAPANESE

## Law Likely to Admit Only Immigrants Direct From Native Place - This Would Prevent Emigration From Honolulu, and State Ports

OTTAWA, Jan. 13.—The department of the interior has under consideration a new departure in regard to immigration. The intention is to amend the regulations so that in future all emigrants must come direct to Canada from their place of birth or country of citizenship. This regulation will apply to the Atlantic as well as to the Pacific. While it is not framed against any particular class of immigrants and will be general in its character, it will have the effect of shutting out Japanese coming from Honolulu to British Columbia.

It is understood that the Japanese authorities have intimated to Mr. Lemieux that there will be no objection from them to any regulations that will exclude the Japanese from Canada, if not emigrating direct from Japan to Canada. In regard to direct emigration, they have given assurances to reduce this to the requested minimum, but they are desirous of doing it in their own way without making any formal compact. If that is done, the present difficulty over Japanese immigration will be solved, but if not, the treaty will be abrogated. That appears to be the general view in ministerial circles here.

The proposed new regulation providing for emigrants coming direct from Japan to Canada. However, emigrants would not be permitted to come by way of the United States ports, thereby insuring a more efficient medical inspection and stricter control over the character of immigrants landing in Canada. However, it is probable that nothing definite

will be done in respect to changing the present regulations until after Hon. Mr. Lemieux has returned to the capital and made his report to the government.

# FRANCE DOES NOT WANT A WAR

PARIS, Jan. 14.—The French government is considerably exercised over the reports cabled to some of the American newspapers last week in which it is represented as secretly desirous of a war between Japan and the United States and the destruction of the American fleet with the ultimate object of witnessing the internationalization of the Panama canal.

The Association Press was authorized to declare that nothing could be farther from the truth. France is the sincere friend of both countries and she is extremely desirous of seeing the present difficulties settled amicably.

When the King drove out to inspect the monument which is being erected to the memory of his grandfather of the same name, a great crowd of unemployed made a rush for the royal carriage, shouting: "Give us bread or give us work!" The men pressed close about the carriage with such apparently hostile intent that the police were called out and the crowd dispersed. The King attempted to treat the affair lightly, but it was seen that he was much disturbed.

# LITTLE AFFAIR NEAR SANTIAGO

VALPARAISO, Chili, Jan. 14.—The encounter three days ago between a party of Germans and the residents of a hamlet about midway between this city and Santiago in which one woman was killed and five were wounded has to-day taken on a more serious aspect. The matter has been brought to the attention of the authorities and the German legation and a thorough investigation will be made. The Germans approached the village after dark and were mistaken for the inhabitants for bandits. The people fled on the travellers with result above set forth.

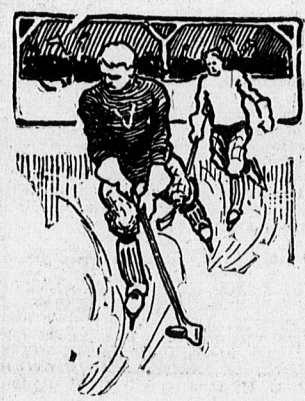

# To The Electors of The City of Charlottetown.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:—  
Having been nominated at a meeting of Electors of Ward 3 and also requested by a number of voters not at that meeting to nominate for the Mayoralty I have decided to do so and will be a candidate for that office at the Civic election in February.

I had the honor of a seat at the Council Board for several years as the representative of Wards 3 and 4 and later on the Board of Sewer and Water Commissioners as Chairman. I feel that my record in these two bodies justify me in soliciting your support for the Mayor's chair.

I am in favor of a certain amount of civic improvements being made each year some assured with our revenue, but I opposed to any large increase in the bonded debt of the City, more particularly in the money market, it being almost impossible to sell Debentures except at a loss—City 3 per cent. Debentures being now offered at a fraction over eighty-three dollars per hundred.

I would recommend a change in our financial year. The year now closes Dec. 31. Under those conditions it is impossible to get the City accounts before the taxpayers in time to give them an intelligent idea of the City finances before nomination day.  
Should you do me the honor of electing me to the important office of Mayor I will to the best of my ability endeavor to discharge the duties belonging to that office in the best interests of the City, as I have always heretofore done.
