## THE QUEEN'S COUNTY GUARDIAN

Head Offices in New Prowse Block—Charlottetown.

The latest news, first of all.  
The steam yacht Sioux arrived in port yesterday at noon.

F. J. Nash, editor of the Charlottetown Patriot and Mrs. Nash, who have been visiting Dr and Mrs N. B. MacKay, leave today for Kentville, where they will spend a few days before returning to Charlottetown.—Halifax spec.

The special train which conveyed A. W. Campbell, Deputy Minister of Railways, and his party on their tour of inspection over the western line to Tignish arrived in this city last evening at eight o'clock. They went to Georgetown and Montague this morning and Vernon in the afternoon.

Dr J. A. McPhee, City, leaves by the morning train for Kinkora, where he is locating, taking over Dr. W. J. McMillan's practice there, who has removed to the City. Dr McPhee having graduated with honors at McGill University, will no doubt prove to be a most skillful and successful physician, and The Guardian wishes him the largest measure of success in his noble profession.

#### RECONSTRUCTION OF RUSSIAN NAVY.

LONDON, June 20.—Reconstructing the Russian navy is proving difficult business. The marine budget committee of the council of empire has refused to endorse any of the government's appropriations as a protest against the failure to uproot the old abuses in the navy department and to reorganize the service from top to bottom. The committee announced that it proposes to apply 750,000,000 rubles (\$375,000,000) to a shipbuilding program. The council of empire's committee replies with some revelations regarding the building of the instalment of bread-noughts now in hand at the navy yards near St. Petersburg. Each of these battleships was to have cost 25,000,000 rubles and been ready for commission in four years from last spring. It is now conceded that each will cost 40,000,000 rubles and that none will be ready before six years. This heavy extra cost and delay is due to the government insisting on building them in home yards at a time when they had not the plant for making the material or technical labor for understanding how to convert the designs into ships.

The committee reports that the upkeep of the Russian navy in 1903, before the Japanese war, when there really was a war fleet, was 107,500,000 rubles, and 40 per cent. of that sum was assigned to building. This year when there is no war fleet and the ships in commission are described as "old goshawks," the appropriation is 55,000,000 rubles, and 15 per cent. of that is marked for constructional purposes. The navy department has not had the courage to reduce the personnel to a proportion approaching the half dozen ships of war now fit for service. The entire naval personnel in Japan amounts this year to 36,000 men, while Russia has still 44,000 men.

In Vladivostok the cost of the 5,000,000 rubles. It includes a naval commandant with a large staff, and the entire sea-going strength of two cruisers.
