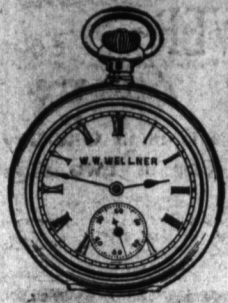

At the Scottish concert last evening in the Opera House Mayor Paton presided very happily and the entertainment afforded by Miss Crawford and Miss Hyde quite charmed and delighted all present. They were at once in accord with their audience, and generously responded to an encore for every one of the twelve numbers on the program. Miss Crawford's first song was, Dark Lochnagar, sung with splendid effect, and on being recalled she gave, with fine feeling Scandalphon, the Angel of Prayer. Her next number, Dear Little Shamrock, was followed by Rocked in the Cradle of the Deep. Her succeeding number was, Irish again, Eileen Elannah, admirably sung in duet with Miss Hyde, and for an encore, Come Back to Erin. She rose to patriotic fervor in her next number, Scotland, and thrilled her hearers greatly. Again they would not be denied the coveted encore. Very tenderly Miss Crawford sang the next numbers on the program, The Dear Old Home and the Bonny Banks of Loch Lomond, and when persistently recalled she sang The Auld Scotch Saes. Later in the evening she evoked the heartiest plaudits and aroused great enthusiasm, and was gracious enough to give, Will ye no Come Back Again. Her remarkable voice of great volume and compass and yet capable of much sweetness and tenderness quite captured the hearts of all who happily were present. Miss Hyde gave a stirring rendition of Tam O'Shanter. In 'Sandy McDonald', speech she was entirely at home and convulsed her hearers with merriment, and this was continued during her impersonation of a little girl which came in an encore. Her strongest piece of work during the evening was the Casket scene from the Merchant of Venice which was given with much spirit and with fidelity to the great dramatist's conception. In the Eclipse Concert Company she gave a laughable burlesque of performances such as some of her hearers seemed almost painfully familiar with. Like Miss Crawford, Miss Hyde was always enthusiastic and recalled, and as often graciously responded. There is awomanly dignity and sincerity about these ladies, which with their clearness of voice and manner place them in a class above the many who from time to time entertain from the stage. To Professor Watts and his five orchestra the audience were indebted for several choice instrumental selections. At the close the National Anthem was reverently sung by Miss Crawford and Miss Hyde, a fitting close to an evening devoted to national melodies. On Thursday night they will appear at Montague and on Friday night at Souris. A genuine treat is in store for all lovers of Scottish music in these two evenings.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Homestead Regulations. ANY even numbered section of Dominion Lands, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, or Alberta, excepting 8 and 36 not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres or less. Entry must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated. Entries must be made personally at the local land office for the district in which the land is situated. A homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years. (2) If the settler or mother, if the father is deceased, of the homestead resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the purpose as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of the homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, Ottawa, of intention to abandon the land. W. W. CORY, Deputy of the Minister of the Interior.
