The New Theatre Ready for Opening at Summerside

Summerside's new theatre, "The Capitol," erected at big expense by Mr. J. J. Gaudet, to supersede his old "Happyland," is now about completed and will be opened early in November. In his new quarters our enterprising citizen will be able to more successfully cater to the amusement seeking public. He has added a fine structure to our town and filled the long-felt want of an opera house which not only meets the needs of a prosperous and ever growing community, but is a credit to the Maritime Provinces. Everything in the way of convenience and accommodation that they can possibly require—second to none, in fact. Every feature of the interior is a delight to the eye and the entire plan, all done by Mr. Gaudet himself, could not possibly be excelled. He has certainly studied the comfort and pleasure of his patrons and will continue to give them his personal attention. It now remains for the amusement seeking public to show their due appreciation.

The Capitol Theatre is exactly opposite the Pioneer Office on Central St., and is a grand addition to this important thoroughfare. The building is 80 by 100 feet; the auditorium has a seating capacity of 500 and the gallery, which is situated at the west end, will accommodate 200. The auditorium is fitted throughout with 1922 model arm opera chairs, imported from Ontario. They are of oak, tip-up pattern, with hat rack beneath, and extremely comfortable. They are arranged in circular form, so that every patron has a full view of the stage, which is enhanced by the foot rack of the floor from back to front. The rows are spaced wider than the laws of Canada or America require, thus giving additional comfort, and ensuring, with the exceptionally wide aisles and side exits provided, that a house packed to capacity can be emptied in two minutes in case of emergency.

The operating booth, which is in the centre of the gallery, is perfectly fireproof, has a secret floor and all the latest equipment. The handsome wall brackets and drop lights from the ceiling were imported from Montreal, by Messrs. Thos. Johnston & Co., Ltd., and the wiring was done by Messrs. Johnston and Huestis. The decorating and white oak panelling is the work of Mr. Wm. Crozier and the over 1000 yards of plastering was laid on by Mr. Hedley Beahart, and Mr. Geo. Baker, the architect. Mr. C. P. Linkletter, the superintendent of construction, and Mr. Gaudet himself are not more than pleased with the job they ought to be.

The stage is 50 by 35 feet and can accommodate 250 people at one time, more than the capacity needed by any company touring the Maritime Provinces. The divided curtain is of heavy blue plush, with heavy gold tassels and is drawn apart from the centre in the most modern style. It is 28 feet by 16 feet and was imported from Montreal. The entire stage flooring is hardwood and will suit all operating companies. There are ample dressing rooms adjoining the stage, with lavatories and every convenience. All in all, the Capitol Theatre is admirably ventilated, splendidly planned and beautifully equipped; better, in fact, than any house of entertainment of its size in the Lower Provinces.

In connection with and entrances from the stage, the auditorium and lobby, there are tea rooms, confectionery and ice cream parlors, which will be under the supervision of Mrs. Gaudet.

Over this extensive addition is the wireless station, one of the most powerful and best equipped plants in the Maritime Provinces. It will provide and broadcast, free of charge, when the weather is propitious, radio concerts for the benefit of patrons to the theatre and tea rooms from New York, Pittsburgh, Detroit, Boston, Montreal and

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., Oct. 30—Janet Waters, 28, a graduate nurse formerly employed by Mrs. R. W. Fowler of Rye, and who described herself as the daughter of a high official of the Canadian Government, was arraigned before Judge Bleakley today, charged with stealing clothes from Mrs. Fowler.
