British Columbia's Big Lumber Losses (Canadian Press) VICTORIA, Aug. 14—British Columbia has lost nearly 7,000,000 feet of lumber business per month to the Northwest United States as a result of the Japanese tariff against Canadian lumber, newspaper reports here, according to estimates given to the government today by lumbermen. A loss of employment for some 1,800 men in woods and mills in the province was estimated.
