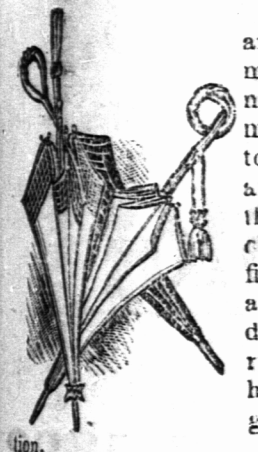

REV. THOS. HICKS, who has labored four years on the Trvon Circuit, has been invited to Yori Circuit, and will take charge after the present Conference year.  
THE re-opening of the Stanhope Presbyterian Church will take place on the 27th inst. The Rev. J. Layton will preach at 11 a. m., the Rev. R. Ope at 3 p. m., and the Rev. D. B. McLeod at 6.45 p. m. Special collections will be taken in aid of the Building Fund.

A delegation from the Presbytery consisting of Revs. O. B. McLeod, Miller, Smith, and Fisher held a meeting in Cavendish on Monday evening the 14th. They came to help the Cavendish congregation to select a site for a new church. The congregation voted to leave the selection to the Presbytery and so the matter stands.

SIR THOMAS LIPTON arrived at Glasgow Saturday and had a long talk with the Glasgow Exhibition Committee, during which the request for the postponement of the challenge for the America's Cup until 1902 was made. The committee would not be put off with a negative answer. Sir Thomas told them that he would very much like to grant their request, but that he had made arrangements ahead to challenge for the cup. Personal requests were asked of him of such strength and in such a way that Sir Thomas wavered a bit, and has delayed giving the committee a definite answer.

REV. W. H. WARREN delivered two very interesting lectures in Cavendish Hall, on Thursday evening the 10th, subject 'Banyan's Pilgrim's Progress.' This lecture was illustrated by a beautiful set of views setting forth the principal character in the 'Immortal A'leg r.' On Wednesday evening the 16th he again delivered a lecture on the 'South African war.' He gave a history of the settlement of South Africa by the Boers and described the principal causes leading up to the present struggle. He also reviewed the war from its commencement to the present time noting all the reverses suffered by the British as well as the victories gained. The Rev. lecturer had also a beautiful set of views of the South African War scenes as well as the heroes engaged in upholding England's honor there, but unfortunately his lantern gave out at the beginning, greatly to the annoyance of the lecturer and audience and he had to give the lecture without the views.
