MR. WALTER LOWE'S CASE.

For some years past there has been pending a claim of Mr. Walter Lowe, contractor, against the Provincial Government. The claim arises out of a contract made with the Government by Mr. Lowe in July 1896 to build a large annex to the Lunatic Hospital for the sum of \$21,300. Mr. Lowe placed a quantity of material on the ground and was prepared to go on with the work when it was found that the plan was impracticable. We need not follow the story through the successive matters first in dispute and the changes since. Suffice it to say that the contract was taken from Mr. Lowe and transferred to another, and he claims that he has sustained very serious loss and damage.

Being unable to agree with the Government, or to secure the reference of his claim to arbitration he desired to have his claim adjudicated by the Supreme Court. But before a claimant can sue the Government in this way he must obtain a fiat from the Lieutenant Governor authorising such action. Both Lieutenant Governor Howland when he held office and Lieutenant Governor McIntyre since he succeeded to that position have declined to sign the fiat necessary to enable Mr. Lowe to take his claim into Court. We presume both Governors were advised by their Executive Councils to take this course, and we offer no criticism upon that action.

But there must be some method by which an aggrieved contractor, or one who think himself aggrieved, can obtain a hearing of his case. Misunderstandings and disagreements are liable to arise between Governments and contractors, as between private individuals or corporations and unless there be some impartial and disinterested tribunal to hear and determine such matters there would exist a condition in which justice would be denied. If we assume for the sake of argument that the Government are wholly in the right and Mr. Lowe as wholly in the wrong, or the reverse of this, or that both are partly at fault, it would seem to most fair-minded persons that it would be fair and just to refer the matters in dispute either to arbitration or to the law Courts. It appears that Mr. Lowe has so far been denied access to either of these tribunals. We now learn that as a last resort he is about to petition the Legislature.

Hon. W. S. Fielding, now Finance Minister of Canada and formerly Provincial Secretary and Premier of Nova Scotia, pointed out this course years ago in a letter to a suitor in which he said:

In some respects it may seem unjust that a Government cannot be sued. The other side of the question, however, is that Parliament is a Supreme Court in all matters in which the Government is concerned, and a committee of Parliament may be relied upon to do justice in any case in which the Government are unable to satisfy the persons with whom they deal. Indeed Parliamentary committees generally take a very generous view of a petitioner's claim, and there are but few cases in which any substantial injustice is done by the absence of a right to sue Government.

We trust that Mr. Lowe may be granted a committee and that a full and fair hearing may be given to both sides without further delay. We pronounce no opinion upon the merits of the case, but we think Mr. Lowe has an undoubted right to a hearing in order that the nature and merits of his claim may be determined. It is due alike to the country and the claimant that this matter should be brought to an issue and finally disposed of.

A proposed new Hospital for the insane in Edinburgh, to contain 1,000 beds is estimated to cost \$1,900,000 or \$1,900 per bed. This is exclusive of a site costing \$105,000, a railway to convey the materials at a cost of \$165,000, and of a water supply to cost \$80,000. These figures make a total of two millions and a quarter, all for one insane hospital.
