U. K. GRAIN CROPS

Grain crops in the United Kingdom this year have been marked by exceptionally high yields. The wheat yield is officially estimated at 21.3 cwt. an acre compared with a 10-year average of 18.7 cwt. and last year's record figure of 20.7. For barley the estimated yield is 18.8 cwt., against a 10 year average of 17.5 cwt., and last year's figure, also the previous highest, or 19.4 cwt. Oats showed the same heavy yield with 18.4 cwt. compared with 16.6 cwt. and 17.7 cwt.
