DISTRIBUTION OF WARSHIPS.

The ordinary distribution of the British naval forces about the world is as follows:

The Mediterranean and Red Sea Squadron, 12 battleships, 8 cruisers and 27 smaller vessels.

The Channel Squadron, 8 battleships, 6 cruisers.

North American and West Indies Squadron, 7 cruisers and 7 smaller vessels.

South-east coast of America Squadron, 2 cruisers, 2 sloops.

Pacific Squadron, 3 cruisers, 3 smaller vessels.

Cape and West Coast of Africa Squadron, 1 battleship, 7 cruisers, 8 smaller vessels.

East India Squadron, 1 battleship, 3 cruisers, 5 smaller craft.

China Squadron, 5 battleships, 17 cruisers, 23 smaller vessels.

Australian Squadron, 8 cruisers, 3 smaller vessels.

Training Squadron, 4 cruisers.

British naval dockyards are located at Antigua, Ascension, Bermuda, Bombay, Bonny, Calcutta, Cape Town, Chatham, Devonport, Esquimaux, Gibraltar, Halifax, Haulbowline, Hong Kong, Jamaica, Malta, Pembroke, Portland, Portsmouth, St. Helena, Sheerness, Sydney, Trincomalee, Wei Hai Wei and West Indies.

Yesterday was a warm day for the violators of the Prohibitory Law, two of the number being mulcted in \$100 fines and another in \$200, the latter for a second offence. Costs of court and the retaining fees for three lawyers are to be paid as well as the fines. We trust that the violators may lay the matter to heart and give up their unlawful trade.

In another column of this issue appears the annual statement of the Merchants' Bank of P. E. Island. The showing is a most favorable one, the profits showing an increase over last year. After paying two semi-annual dividends of 4 per cent each the Rest Account was increased by over \$60,000 and now stands at \$266,000. President Hartz, the directorate and the manager are to be congratulated on the prosperous state of the bank's affairs.

Harper's Weekly tells that at a meeting of medical men in Vienna the other day Dr. Ullmann presented a woman, of sixty-two years, whose entire stomach had been removed in an operation for cancer. Nevertheless she digests all her food, and has gained weight since the operation. The doctor stated that the operation of removing the stomach had now been successfully performed over twenty times. The stomach really plays only a small part in the complex act of digestion, its principal use being that of a reservoir.

MR. TARTE AND THE PREFERENCE.

Mr. Tarte is more outspoken than other Conservative leaders in regard to the existing preferential tariff. He altogether disclaims the idea of its being "a free gift" as Sir Wilfrid Laurier declared it to be.

"We believe, for our part that the preference of 33 1-3 per cent, is too much. It is of a kind to destroy groups of Canadian industries which have need of protection against English products, as against those of other countries. There is no reason why we should continue to give to British goods the preference extended by the Laurier Government with the consent of Parliament, if England does not pay us back by giving our products a preference,—as Mr. Chamberlain suggests. Let us attend to our own affairs first. Charity begins at home."

There is this to be said for Mr. Tarte, he is the most frank and outspoken of our public men. Friends and foes alike know what he means. And what he has to say about the preference will find favor in Quebec where the Fielding preferential tariff has always been looked upon as one-sided.
