Motion Made For Winding Up Of Steel Corp.

(Canadian Press) HALIFAX, March 15.—In a motion before Mr. Justice Chisholm in the Supreme Court made late this afternoon, the National Trust Company of Toronto in its capacity as receiver and manager, asked for the winding up of the Dominion Steel Corp., largest constituent of the British Empire Steel Corp., and holding company of the coal company and the Dominion Iron and Steel Co.

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Mar. 15.—The Empress of Canada which collided yesterday with a Japanese steamer in the Shanghai river has proceeded to Hong Kong where she will go in dry dock for two weeks, according to advices to the Canadian Pacific steamships here, to whom the liner belongs.

League to Function in Time of War

GENEVA, Mar. 15.—Swift functioning of the council of the League of Nations in time of war will be provided for in a report submitted today by a special committee appointed to study the problem. The provisions adopted the statement when peace is endangered, the council convention immediately can request organizations or individuals to exercise a controlling influence over the disputes or can send a commission to the seat of the trouble to ascertain the facts with a view to bringing about a speedy settlement.

South Africa Will Appoint Envoys to Foreign Countries

(Canadian Press) CAPETOWN, South Africa, Mar. 15.—Die Burger, official organ of the nationalist party and representing the views of the government, says it is practically certain that the union of South Africa soon will appoint charges d'affaires in several countries. It remarks that in view of the decisions of the latest imperial conference regarding the status of the various commonwealths of the British Empire that the union should have diplomatic envoys in the principal countries.

15,000 Cotton Mill Workers on Strike

This was intimated at the White House today when the official spokesman for the British Empire were understood to be included in the invitation sent to the Empire through the British government.
