### THE ALLIANCE AND THE DOCTORS.

The Provincial Temperance Alliance at its annual meeting adopted a resolution, admonitory to the medical practitioners of the Province in regard to the "indiscriminate issuing of certificates for liquor when altogether unnecessary for medical purposes." At the first blush this may seem to some persons an unnecessary and possibly a presumptuous act on the part of the Alliance. Any such feeling must give way on second thought to a feeling of deep regret that circumstances should be such as to call for this reminder of past wrongdoing and of penalties that may be enforced in the future.

We are well within the facts when we say that a number of practising physicians in town and country have abused the trust reposed in them and have violated both the spirit and the letter of Scott Act and Prohibitory Law in the issuing of certificates to men who simply wanted liquors for beverage purposes. In thus becoming the panders of an unlawful traffic these men have degraded a noble profession and brought reproach upon other physicians who carefully observe

both the moral law and the law of the land. The evil complained of has assumed such large proportions as has called for the intervention of the Alliance.

Non-resident physicians have issued certificates where only resident physicians are authorized to do so; certificates have been issued by the hundred in pencil writing; in some cases not dated as to time or place, without any official title to the name of the doctor prescribing; specifying in some cases no quantity and in other cases quantities much larger than the law permits, and not specifying that the liquor is for medicinal purposes only, and not as a beverage. In other cases more of bottles have been certified for by one or two doctors in one day for as many "patients" all of whom were well enough to take a railway journey to town, and who returned not the better but much the worse for the "medicine" they procured. The nature of these irregularities is such as to demonstrate that they are not committed ignorantly, but wantonly and defiantly.

This gross misconduct has become largely a scandal against the entire medical profession of the Island, which so far as we are aware has taken no measures to purge itself of members who have been guilty of such immoral, unlawful and discreditable practices. It is under these emergent circumstances that the Alliance has sounded a note of warning, and is fully justified in so doing. If this wholesale pandering to depraved tastes, in violation of law shall be hereafter continued, the duty will become imperative to enforce the penalties which the law provides. The offenders have had fair warning. They know how to avoid the unpleasant publicity which with the fines prescribed, must result from further violations of the law. Surely it is not too much to ask all doctors to obey the law, as we trust a majority of them do.

There is a lack of enthusiasm in the Summerside Journal's announcement of the result of the voting on the Scott Act. The weather is colder now.

The necessary signatures to the petition for a vote on the Scott Act in Queens County should be secured without delay. It would be better if practicable to have the voting in Queens and Kings on the same day, and that as early as practicable. Thereafter we shall have uniformity of law and administration in regard to the liquor traffic throughout the Province.

### EDITOR'S MAIL.

#### MORE ABOUT SUGAR BEETS.

Sir, Mr. Norton's letter in a recent issue of your paper is the latest contribution to the sugar beet question. While recognizing the excellent intentions of those who aim at promoting any enterprise for the general welfare, there are various local conditions that must always be considered.

It is now fully understood by all practical farmers in this Province that a system of animal husbandry is necessary for the preservation of soil fertility and must be pursued more generally in future. The fertilizing material thus retained, and all other available supplies, are scarcely sufficient to maintain the fertility of the soil. Now it is well understood that the sugar beet is one of the most exhausting of crops, a chemical analysis showing that the amount of plant food removed by it from the soil is far in excess of that taken by any other crop. The high degree of fertilizing thus necessary, the application of all available manure to this crop, and its subsequent removal from the farm, would have the undesirable effect of still further depleting its fertility. If it is at all desirable to grow sugar beets, it would be much more profitable to feed them on the farm, as experience has shown them to be more valuable when used in this way than when sold for factory purposes.

Another objection that arises in the scarcity of farm labor, even under existing conditions. It may be urged against this plea, that the introduction of a new industry would afford employment at home for those who otherwise might go abroad to seek it.

The establishment of the dairying industry, however, and the high prices now prevailing for all the finer food products, thus affording, as one would suppose, profitable employment at home, has not had the result of holding our people to the land.
