AMBASSADOR SENDS REPORTS

PARIS, Sept. 23.—The report of the Ambassador at Washington, Mr. T. Herrick, who has completed an exhaustive investigation of the system of agricultural credit facilities which are now in operation in Europe.

The Ambassador's report recommends the adoption by the United States of a Bi-fascist System of Agricultural Co-operative Credit Societies.

It includes organizations composed of small co-operative societies whereby farmers are able to borrow money for short time on their collective guarantee.
