ARE VOICES DEGENERATING.

A Recognized Authority Expresses the
Opinion that They Are.

Lady Greville complains bitterly
in her weekly column in The London
Graphic that English women's voices
are "no longer low and sweet," and
that they are rather "loud and shrill"
or "deep and gruff," and is dis-
posed to ascribe this decline of the
English woman's voice to American
influence. What Lady Greville
says about the deterioration of wo-
men's voices is perfectly true. The
fact of the matter is that people
nowadays no longer pay as much
attention as they used to do to the
cultivation of a good voice—excepting
among the reigning houses. With
the latter Scotch nurses are in great
demand. Indeed, there is scarcely a
prince or princess of the blood in
Europe who has not spent the years
of childhood beneath the care of a
dame hailing from the north of the
Tweed. This is due to the fact that
the sweetest voice in the world is
that of the Scotch woman. It is
simply irresistible for the sounds of
the vowels are absolutely unhamper-
ed. The sound may be high or low,
but there is no discordance any-
where, and the harmony of the well-
pitched organ is soothing in the ex-
treme, so much so, of a truth, that
it seems created on purpose for lul-
ling a baby to sleep with its in-
dulgent soft cadence.

It is a valuable gift—a really fine-
toned voice. It has been responsible
for more than half the success of
Sarah Bernhardt, and was also one
of the most remarkable characteristics
of Yvonne Guilbert.

The voice should be educated like
any other of our faculties, and that
not alone to the view of singing, but
also for the purpose of developing
its beauties in ordinary conversa-
tion. It is an instrument, and one
of the most exquisite and delicate of
instruments. So why should we not
take as much trouble in that direc-
tion as we do to teach our children
piano, harp, guitar or violin? An un-
melodious voice spoils the loveliness
of any woman, be she as perfect of
form and face as Venus herself,
whereas a musical voice renders the
homeliest woman attractive. No
voice which has an affected ring in
it, however, will ever be really fine.

Affection is sufficient to mar the
beauty of any organ. One feels the
effort of enunciation, the forced low-
ness, and it hurts one's love of the
truly and naturally beautiful.
One of the most perfect of voices
was that of the late Queen Victoria.
It would be difficult to find one
which possessed more power and
charm. Without the slightest effort
she was wont to pitch it in such a
way that when talking in public her
farthest listeners could hear her
perfectly, and moreover there was a
peculiar intonation there which made
one think of the sound of a silver
horn mellowed by distance. At times
she was wont to give the tones of
the voice a persuasive, gentle, echo-
ing harmony which entranced every-
one, and that without the slightest
affectation.

King Edward's voice is likewise
well trained, and, while it has not
the silvery sweetness of one of that
of his mother, yet it is remarkable
for the clearness of its enunciation
and for its capacity to be at all
times at other moments he can send
it forth ringing like a clarion. He
has it under perfect control.
