CORONERS' INQUESTS.

A correspondent writes THE GUARDIAN taking objection to the inquest on the body of the late Donald Currie in this city having been held on Sunday. He points out that an English authority on the duties of coroners says that an inquest should not be held on Sunday. Our correspondent however very fairly admits that the P. E. Island statute of 1876, relating to coroners specifically provides that a coroner "may if necessary, hold inquests on Sunday," but he does not think the case on Sunday last was one which rendered such action necessary. We hold a different opinion from that expressed by our correspondent. A little thought and some knowledge of the coroner's duties will make it appear that it is the officer's duty to act at once. If we take the case where a body is found on Sunday apparently dead as the result of an unlawful act of the deceased or of another, the coroner is obliged to act promptly. Even in countries where he may not hold an inquest on Sunday he must issue his precept forthwith to a constable and summon a jury who shall be empanelled and sworn. The jury and coroner together must as speedily as possible and under the conditions where it was first found.

At this stage the inquest might be adjourned and the testimony taken on the following day. But there are many circumstances that may arise that frequently render it important that the entire proceedings of the inquest should be closed as speedily as possible. In the case under consideration all the witnesses who could throw light upon the cause of death appear to have been present in the house where the body was. The jury empaneled deemed that an autopsy was necessary, and the importance of this duty being attended to as soon as possible after death is apparent. So much being necessary to be done on the Sunday, and as the case was clear and there being no other reason for an adjournment than because the day was a Sunday, we think the Coroner was fully justified in hearing the evidence on the spot and at the time and concluding the inquiry then and there.

Some experience as a coroner in another Province has satisfied the writer of this article that it is at rare intervals necessary to hold an inquest on Sunday, and that the provisions of the Act of 1876 in allowing the coroner discretionary power in such cases is a wise one. We think the law of the Sabbath is a hundred times violated by the unnecessary burial of the dead on a Sunday where it is once broken by the unnecessary holding of a coroner's inquest. No doubt it is sometimes imperative or necessary that burial shall take place on Sunday, but the practice is far more common than is necessary or desirable. Too frequently a Sunday burial is only a convenient way of saving so much time from a working day. For this reason many clergymen in this and in other lands have felt it to be their duty to discourage Sunday burials except in cases of imperative necessity.

From the salt mines of Northwich, in Cheshire, England, 1,200,000 tons of salt are shipped annually. The whole underlying country is simply one mass of salt. The principal deposit is about 300 feet below the surface. Shafts are sunk and the salt rock is blasted and brought to the surface. Some salt is also produced by evaporating the brine where the salt has been dissolved by water and formed underground lakes. It has happened frequently that the surface of the earth has fallen in over the mines carrying down houses and in one case nearly an entire village.

The decision of the Senate Committee on the Cook charges to report the evidence taken without expressing an opinion was a commendable one. It would have been impossible for all the members of the committee to have agreed upon a formal report. The ending is no doubt a very tame one as compared with several previous inquiries in which the conduct of members of past Governments were concerned. The fact remains that Cook's charges were not proven, even to the satisfaction of those members of the Senate who sympathized with him. Still we think it well that the Senate undertook the inquiry and conducted it so fairly. When once the charges were publicly made the public desired to know what facts were behind them, and also to learn something more about Mr. Cook himself. This they have learned, and if he has suffered more than any other living man by the inquiry he has only himself to blame.
