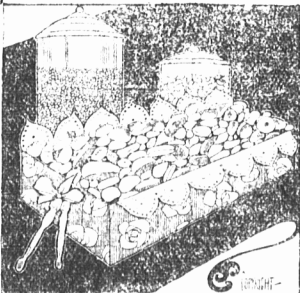

GOD'S DISTURBING HAND AWAKENS OUR LATENT POWERS.

THE LESSON TO BE LEARNED

We Must Learn to Depend Upon Ourselves, So Far As Human Being—May Depend Upon Themselves—Whom the Lord Loveth He Chasteneth—How the Elements of a Strong Character Are Acquired.

we were finally lost to view in the great heaven of light. At last, the old eagles teach the young eagles to fly. first, by the sharp blow of the hawk and the pushing off the nest; second, by the rescue and the bringing back to the nest; third, by the object lessons, which say: "Come, children, do as I am doing now. Come, lift your wings as my wings flap, and go up and up." God teaches us how to fly by pushing us off into the great abyss of trouble. He rescues us by the infinite power of the atoning cross. He then teaches us how to go up and up and up by the object lessons of Christ's earthly life.

But there is still another lesson to be learned from the old eagle stirring up her nest. She pushes out her young in order to make room for the next batch of fledglings. If she did not do this there would be only one brood hatched in the nests. Thus the eagle's offspring would only consist of two or three or four young. But no sooner does the old eagle finish raising one family than she prepares to raise another batch of fledglings.

Have you ever considered how soon this old earth would be overcrowded and an unfit place in which to live if God did not push the generations on and up? This is an age of the slaughter of the innocents. Life is in mortal combat for its life. The earth is soaked with blood. The guillotine never ceases its endless chop. Every birthday is a corresponding death rattle. Every cradle implies a grave. So rapidly can shell life propagate that one thousand million times in a month. A common codfish lays between eight and nine million eggs every year. But, though the human race does not reproduce itself as rapidly as the insectile world, or even as the cattle, yet, if allowed to live on this earth uninterruptedly, it would soon be impossible for the growing members of the human family to exist.

New generations come, and room must be made for them. The infant leaves the cradle to a successor and becomes the youth, the youth passes on to manhood and on to old age, and the younger generations tread upon his heels and every step. And just he passes on into eternity. What then? The apostle says, "It doth not yet appear what we shall be," but we know enough of that life to be full of hope. To those who through Christ have made peace with God there is the promise of continued development. "They that wait on the Lord," says the prophet, "shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run and not be weary; and they shall walk and not faint." In that heavenly state there shall be neither hunger, nor pain, nor weariness, nor sickness, nor death. Even the eagle, long lived as it is, grows old and dies, but there we shall live forever. And the love of our Father in heaven is cleaving the iron and iron fetters are transferred from one brood to the next, but nothing can separate us from the love of God, whose heart is large enough for all his children.

Would you have such a future to anticipate? Then let that power which God promises to impart come even now into your life. The only thing that can blot out that prospect is sin. Dread sin as you would dread the bite of a serpent. Theodore L. Cuyler, the grand old man of the Brooklyn pulpit, graphically described a scene which I have carried in my memory for many years. A peasant living upon the mountain side was on his way home in the evening hour. Tired after a hard day's work, he turned to look down the valley which as a panorama stretched away at his feet. Suddenly he saw a mighty winged eagle begin to lift itself from a distant cliff. Higher and higher it rose, gorgeous amid the fires of the setting sun. Suddenly its movements became labored. It struggled and fought in midair and seemed to be gasping for breath. First one wing became helpless, then the second wing. Then the huge bird, like a stone, shot through the air and fell dead. The peasant could not understand the cause until he went to the side of the bird and picked up the still warm corpse. Then to his horror there wriggled from between his fingers a tiny serpent that had fastened itself under the bird's wing and sucked the life out of the monarch of the air. So sin as a venomous, clinging serpent, tries to fasten itself upon us. The mighty winged eagle are the more anxious that satanic serpent is for our life's blood. But God will to-day not only save us, as the mother eagle does her young, but he does more. Christ has given us his life in order to overcome the power of the serpent. He has died in order that we might live. In this text of an eagle stirring up the nest of her young cannot you feel the touch of a saving Christ?

THE SUNDAY SCHOOL.

LESSON XII, SECOND QUARTER, INTERNATIONAL SERIES, JUNE 15.

Text of the Lesson, Matt. xxviii, 1-15. Memory Verses, 9, 10—Golden Text, I Cor. xv, 20—Commentary Prepared by Rev. D. M. Stearns.

[Copyright, 1904, by American Press Association.] The awful day of last week's lesson, the only day of its kind in the whole history of the world, the day of the atonement for the sins of the world, came to an end. When the soldiers came to take down the bodies and broke the legs of the thieves to hasten their death they found that Jesus was already dead, so they broke not His legs, thus fulfilling another Scripture, "A bone of Him shall not be broken" (Ex. xii, 46; Num. ix, 12; Ps. xxxiv, 20). One of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and forthwith came there out blood and water, again fulfilling Scripture, "They shall look on Him whom they pierced" (Zech. xii, 10).

Joseph of Arimathea, a rich man, a disciple, asked Pilate for the body of Jesus, and with the aid of Nicodemus wrapped the body in spices and laid it in Joseph's new tomb, and thus Isaiah, 53, was fulfilled, "They made His grave with the rich in His death." At the request of the chief priests, Pilate permitted the Jews to seal the tomb and set a watch. Certain women, having seen where His body was laid, prepared spices and ointments that they might come and anoint Him when the Sabbath was past, for they had not received His word that He would rise again the third day. They loved Him much, but did not fully believe all He had said.

Early on the first day of the week the women came to the sepulcher expecting to find a dead body which they might with loving hands anoint. They wondered who would roll away the stone, but seemingly did not know of the seal and the guard. Arriving at the tomb, they find the stone rolled away, the keepers trembling for fear and a messenger from heaven, in heavenly raiment, with a message for them, which is recorded in verses 5 to 7 of our lesson.

In this message let us give special attention to the words "For ye know that He is risen as He said," "Go quickly and tell His disciples," "Remember, such Scriptures as Gen. xv, 1; Rev. i, 7, and the many "fear nots" between those two. With the angels "Go, tell" verse 19, and His special message to Mary Magdalene, "Go to My brethren and say unto them, I ascend to My Father and your Father and to My God and your God" (John xx, 17). Compare Isaiah, vi, 3, "I consider if you are willing to say, 'Here am I; send me!' The fear and great joy of verse 8 may be explained by Ps. ii, 11, "Serve the Lord with fear and rejoice with trembling;" also by Phil. ii, 12, "For there is a holy awe which is not inconsistent with great joy. A fear to grieve Him is always helpful."

A very brief glance is all we feel led to give to verses 11 to 15. These watchmen were well paid for their lying, but today many will lie for very little money, possibly not knowing their Father nor His and their final doom (John viii, 44; Rev. xx, 10; xxi, 8). There must have been much bribery all round when a guard of soldiers could, without fear of death, testify that they slept while on duty. As to the body being stolen, they would certainly be strange thieves who would or could leave the grave-clothes lying as when they contained the body and wrap carefully by itself the napkin that had been about His head (John xx, 6, 7).

But, leaving this devilish episode of elders and soldiers, let us rejoice that Christ is risen and that we, believing in Him, are risen with Him and seated with Him in the heavens (Col. iii, 1; Eph. ii, 6, 7). Note also that if Christ be not risen preaching is vain, faith is vain, no sins are forgiven and no one is saved (I Cor. xv, 14-19); but since He is risen all is well, and a risen Christ at God's right hand, having all power in heaven and on earth and saying, "Go ye, therefore, and teach all nations," and, lo, I am with you all the days," should have hundreds of thousands rushing to do His bidding and, like the wise men from the east, pouring their gifts at His feet. But it is too much like the story of the ten lepers. Our Lord is still saying, "Were there not ten cleansed, but where are the nine?" Either unbelief or ingratitude, or both, seem much more prevalent than devotion to Him who gave Himself for us.

During the forty days between His resurrection and ascension He showed Himself alive by many infallible proofs and was ever speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God. If the kingdom was as much upon our hearts as it was upon His we would be more ready to follow Him fully at all costs, counting all things but dress for Him. Our heartfelt prayer would be "that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection." (Phil. iii, 10).

Give attention to this study, if time permit, to His various appearances after His resurrection: To Mary, to the other women, to Peter, to the two who walked to Emmaus and to the eleven; all these on the first day. Then there were at least five other appearances before He ascended—to the eleven a week later when Thomas was present, to James, to the seven at the sea of Galilee, to over 500 at one time, and one the day of His ascension. Note also the post-ascension appearances to Stephen, to Saul and to John at Patmos. Emphasize that He always showed Himself, and may we all become wholeheartedly devoted to Him. If we only knew Him as we might and should we would devotedly cry, "To me to live is Christ!" (Phil. i, 21)
