BEFORE Stipendiary Blanchard at Georgetown Prosecutor Bears obtained convictions as follows: Against Maggie Young, Montague, Flora Ann Poulton Georgetown, and Isabella McAulley of Annandale. A case adjourned against William Mahar and one dismissed against Isabella McAulley of Annandale. The Stipendiary intends in future to enforce the severest penalties of the law on witnesses for not attending on subpoena.

At the Police Court yesterday morning all the evidence for the prosecution in the case against Patrick Doherty, for violation of the Prohibition Act was put in. As the defendant was not present the case was adjourned till to-day on from day to day and a warrant ordered to be issued to bring the defendant into court. The case against George Oler for breach of the same act was adjourned for one week as one of the witnesses failed to appear. Timothy Creamer was convicted of a first offence against the above act, and fined one hundred dollars and costs or three months imprisonment in the common goal. Two lads, Edward McCabe and John Hanna were each fined five dollars or fifteen days for corner loafing and refusing to move on when requested by a police officer. Complaints have been made frequently about the number of loafers, who block the principal streets, and the police have determined to commence a vigorous campaign against such corner loafers.
