Writers Of Book Study Canada's Post-War Period

TORONTO, Jan. 24 - (CP) - Difficulties Canada will face in achieving social security in the post-war era are outlined in "Canada after the War" (Macmillan) comprising 10 "studies in political, social and economic policies in post-war Canada."

The 324-page book is edited by Alexander Brady, professor of political economy at the University of Toronto, and F. R. Scott, professor of civil law at McGill University, Montreal, who explains that the volume is not intended to provide any inflexible guide to the future.

Rather "it is hoped that the cardinal features of our major post-war problems are here usefully presented and that from the various chapters will emerge valuable guides to policy."

The book is not planned as an integrated program, like that which a pressure group of a political party might presumably offer. Each article in itself is intended to submit ideas and information to further the discussion of an important issue and freedom was left to the individual contributor in the development of his subject.

The book is divided into two main sections, "Political and Social Policies" and "Economic Policies." The five studies in the first are:

"National Policy," by B. S. Kierstead, professor of economics at McGill University; "Parliamentary Democracy," by Mr. Brady; "The Constitution and the Post-War World," by Mr. Scott; "The Reconstruction of the Social Services," by Charlotte Widdon, widely-known social worker; "Canada and the World," by F. H. Soward, professor of history at the University of British Columbia.

The five studies in the second section are: "The Project of Full Employment and Its Implications," by D. C. MacGregor, assistant professor of political economy at the University of Toronto; "Problems of International Economic Reconstruction," by J. F. Parkinson, assistant professor of political economy at the University of Toronto; "Exchange Control during and After the War," by F. A. Knox, professor of economics at Queen's University; "Canadian Agriculture in the Post-war World," by W. M. Drummond, professor of agricultural economics and former head of that department at the Ontario Agricultural College at Guelph; "A Long-Term Policy for Canadian Industry," by F. Hankin, Montreal industrialist.
