Slow Dealings On Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, June 23 (CP)—Selected issues among papers were stronger, industrials were about mixed while the other groups were irregular in slow dealings on the stock exchange and curb market today. The list was narrow. Closing averages of the Montreal Stock Market listed papers up 3.38 to 332.37, industrials up 7 to 123.4, utilities off 1 to 76.6, banks up .05 to 27.03 and golds up 33 to 71.46. Trading slumped with approximately 40,000 shares of industrial stock traded.

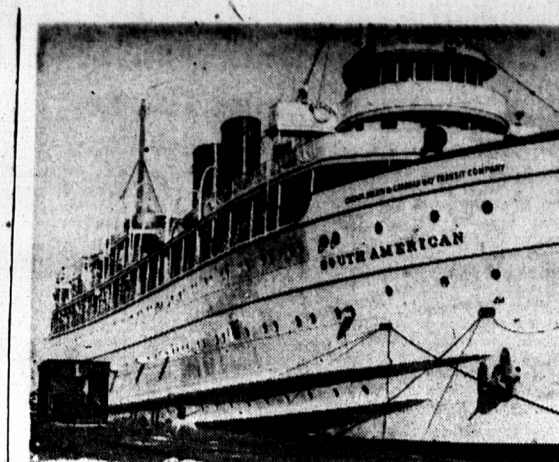
In the paper section International led the move ahead closing at \$1 1-8 up 1-8 while Consolidated Bank at 17 5-8 up 1-8. B. C. Forest added 1-8 at 3 7-8. Abitibi Common was off 1-4 at 17. Abitibi Preferred neutralized an early loss of 1-8 to close unchanged at 13 3-4. National Drug was active in the industrial group, up 3-4. Canadian West Lumber, off 1-8 in early trading, closed unchanged at 3 1-8 and Brand & Millen closed unchanged at 2 1-8. Imperial Tobacco was off 1-8 at 15 and Southmount dropped 3 cents at 40. In the alcoholics Seagrams closed up 1-4 at 17 1-8 while Canadian Breweries overcame an early 1-8 loss to close unchanged at 24 1-2. Shawinigan closed off 1-8 in utilities at 22 1-2 while Bell closed unchanged at 187 and Brazilian ed unchanged at 22.

In the oils, Home added 10 cents at 405 and Pacific added 7-8 at 14. Imperial, maintained an early gain of 1-8 to the close. Losers included Homestead, off 1-2 cents at 40. B. A. closed unchanged at 26 1-2. International Nickel, more active, closed off 1-4 at 36 in metals. C.P.R. was ahead 1-2 in carriers closing at 12 1-2 and Royal Bank added 1-8 at 23 in the financial group.

In the mines, quieter today, Consolidated Cadillac added 1 cent at 42 and Santiago was up 1 cent. East Sullivan was off 15 cents at 3.45. Trading box score: Stock traded 170, higher 36, lower 44, unchanged 73, new highs 6, new lows 6.

Gold Record Gains On Toronto Stock Exchange

TORONTO, June 23 (CP)—Gold record, substantial overall losses in trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange today but base metals and western oils were irregular on a minor trend to lower prices. Dulama, a junior gold, featured trading today on more than 375,000 shares for a gain of 25 cents at 61. Another sizeable trader was Base Metals Corp. on about 110,000 shares to lose 2 3-4 at 11 1-4.

The exchange's closing index listed golds down 2.02 to 112.03, base metals -15 to 83.15, and western oils 23 to 22.36. Golds softened through the day with the pace quickening toward close. Seniors posted one gain, Hallnor 40, at \$4.75 and eight losses including Bralorne 1-4 at 11, Dome 1-4 at 23 1-4, Hollinger 1-4 at 11, Kerr Addison 3-8 at 16, Lake Shore 3-8 at 15 1-4, McIntyre 1-2 at 61 1-2. Juniors were off on a ratio of about three losses for every gain.

The few gainers in points included Haker, Magnet, Pacific Eastern, Roybar, Sylvanite and Dulbec. Losers took in Armistice, Central Patricia, Grant, Healey, Joliet, Letch, Little Long Lac, Macassa, MacLeod, Madsen, Pamour, Pickle Crow, Sullivan. Three gains in the base metals were Falconbridge 15 at \$4.30, Silver Miller 1 at 33, and Steep Rock 5 at \$195. Losses were posted by Base Metals Corp., Smelters 1-4 at 84 1-4, East Sullivan 10 at \$3.45, Hudson Bay 1-4 at 44 1-4, Noranda 1-4 at 46 1-2, Quebec 1-4 at 17 3-4.

Western oils were off in majority with the range fairly narrow. Better gainers were Home Oil 10 at \$4.10, Roxana 5 at 80 and losers were Dalhousie 5 at 61, Globe 3 at 58, Anglo-Canadian 2 at \$1.70. Montgomery Ward, Deere, Glenn Martin, American Telephone, Northern American, Anaconda, Kennebec, Cerro de Pasco, General Electric, U. S. Gypsum, Schenley, Burlington Mills, N. Y. Central, Pennsylvania Railroad, Northern Pacific and Baltimore and Ohio. Youngstown Sheet was down 1-8 at 62 5-8, Dow Chemical 1 at 170 and U. S. Steel 1-2 at 68. Declines were shown for Sears Roebuck, Air Reduction, Johns-Manville, Philip Morris, Texas Co., Socony, Armour and National Distillers.

New York Stocks Resume Advance

(By Victor Eubank) NEW YORK, June 23 (AP)—Stocks generally resumed the advance today although light profit cashing put brakes on many leaders. Investment demand and further short covering again was based on a more optimistic view of the business situation and waning worries regarding a possible fall recession. The Associated Press 60-stock composite was up 3 of a point at 84.4, a high since April 7. Distillers Seagram, up 1-2 at noon, closed up 1-8. McIntyre closed up 1-4 while Canadian Pacific added 1-4. Dome Mines was unchanged. On the curb, Lake Shore advanced 3-8. J. I. Case added 2 5-8 at 38 3-8, Nickel Plate Railway 2 1-8 at 29 1-2, Douglas Aircraft 1 3-4 at 55, U. S. Rubber 1-2 at 47, American Woolen 1-4 at 33 5-8, International Paper 1 1-2 at 49, American Can 1 3-8 at 92 3-4, American Smelting 1-8 at 55 5-8, Chesapeake and Ohio 1 3-8 at 46 3-4 and Great Northern Railway 1-8 at 41 1-8.
