All can now see how entirely desirable it was that the people of India should have had the opportunity of seeing their Sovereigns face to face and of witnessing their installation to the imperial office and dignity upon Indian soil.

We may hope for a royal tour throughout the over-sea Dominions and dependencies before many years have passed.

It is the good fortune of the British people of the present generation that their King and Queen are in the prime of healthful and vigorous manhood and womanhood and withal so active and energetic and so loyally devoted to the promotion of the welfare and happiness of their people.

The late King Edward was a great and wise King, but it was his lot to come to the throne comparatively late in life and there are but few who can remember the late Queen Victoria except as an aged personage, although both were greatly revered and beloved.

Under our monarchical system, to which we are all so much attached, we have had during successive reigns the great advantage of rulers born and trained to rule, with noble traditions and examples for their guidance, rulers who were of no party but above all parties, whose pleasure it had been to rule justly and who have had the wisdom to rule wisely and so to find their rich reward in the affectionate loyalty and devotion of those whom thus they served.

The iron and steel interests have evidently not been idle at Ottawa. A despatch from the capital tells that the expired bounties on pig iron are to be restored to the tune of \$1 per ton on iron produced from foreign ore and \$1.50 per ton if produced from Canadian ore.

Mr. McPhee the cattle buyer who was present, on being called upon, said he was in favor of the Short-horn, as it was beef he was after. For a dairy cow he thought perhaps the Holstein was the best, if you had plenty of feed.

THE CIVIC MEETING TONIGHT.

This evening is fixed for the discussion of civic affairs by the numerous candidates for the offices of Mayor, Water Commissioners and Ward Councillors. They are said to number twenty-four in all. That naturally leads to the impression that the speeches must necessarily be brief.

Three hours is about as long as it is ever convenient to keep any meeting interested, even in time of high political excitement, and if that period is not to be exceeded the average speech must be cut down to seven and a half minutes each. These observations are by no means intended to discourage the candidates in their oratorical efforts. A very good speech may be made in seven minutes or even in three minutes, but few can do it without careful thinking and "boiling down."

A noted American orator was once asked what time he would require to prepare a speech of two hours on a given subject with which he was fairly familiar and replied that one day would be sufficient. "But if you were asked to speak for only five minutes?" was asked. "In that case I would require two weeks for preparation," was the reply. The boiling down of a super-abundance of matter so that it can be delivered effectively in a few minutes is the happy art of only the few, but it is none the less worth the attention of all who address public gatherings.

Pity for those who must come last in so long a list of speakers, for they will have a tired auditory to address and possibly they will have to speak to the backs of those who are departing. Perhaps if the Mayoralty candidates were to be reserved to close out the meeting it would assure the holding out of the interest to the last, but they could hardly be expected to take second place to the candidates for less important positions. In any case a large attendance may be expected at the meeting.
