In Memoriam Contract Bridge

There is an important distinction between defensive tricks which are bound to come to you sooner or later and those for which you must take some active step. East's failure to perceive that distinction was the root of his blunder in today's hand.

Deceased had for some time been employed by Davis & Fraser Ltd., of Charlottetown, as Night Engineer of the Plant. About six o'clock a. m. the building was discovered to be on fire and while attempting to close a steel door in order to prevent further damage, Mr. Watters was overcome by smoke, thereby meeting his untimely death.

East's first mistake was in not taking out the double to five diamonds.

West opened the king of clubs, and East made another mistake when he played low. No harm resulted, however, since West then undered his king of diamonds.

East won the second trick with the king of diamonds and properly cashed the ace of clubs. West discarded a heart. That left dummy with only spades and hearts, and East, a minor partner, made the ace of hearts. Hence East led a heart.

That was all South needed to make his contract. He won with the ace, discovered the trump break by leading the spade king, and easily drew West's trumps. The hearts then gave declarer all the tricks he needed for his doubled contract.

If East had only stopped to think he would have realized that that could not be the sort of trick that should be led even if the defenders did nothing about it; if South had a losing heart he would have to give it up sooner or later, a body, conducted the last and final rites for their departed Brother, under the direction of A. At the fourth trick, East should have led the king of clubs—forcing dummy to ruff. That would not help declarer and couldn't hurt West. On the contrary, it would have insured West's trump trick.
