**BURN'T ALMONDS**—2 cups brown sugar, 2 cups almonds (blanched), 1 cup boiling water. Put sugar in sauce pan, pour over boiling water and place on range. Stir until sugar is dissolved, bring to the boiling point and let boil 10 minutes. Add almonds and cook, stirring constantly until nuts are browned and well coated with caramel. Turn on an oiled sieve to strain and cool.

**STUFFED PRUNES**—Remove stones from large selected raisins, and cook in hot olive oil until plump. Drain on with salt, bread paper and sprinkle with salt and patricia.

**STRAINED FIGS**—Steam bag figs until soft. Cool and make in each an incision lengthwise. Stuff with half Marshmallow and an English walnut meat broken to pieces. Close press into shape and serve in paper cases.

**PEANUT BUTTER FUDGE**—2 cups sugar, 2 cup milk, 4 tablespoons peanut butter, 1 teaspoon vanilla. Few grains of salt. Put sugar and milk in sauce pan, bring to the boiling point and let boil until a soft ball may be formed when mixture is tried in cold water. Remove from range, add remaining ingredients and beat until creamy. Turn into a butter pan to three fourths inch in depth, cool slightly and cut in squares, using a sharp pointed knife.

**MARSHMALLOW FUDGE**—3 cups brown sugar, 1 cup milk, 1 lb. Marshmallow, Butter size of walnut, 1 cup English walnuts. Let sugar and milk stand until dissolved. Boil to soft ball, sugar added butter and marshmallows. Stir until they have dissolved. Beat until creamy.

**NON-RETENABLE D & A CORSETS**

Always stir fondant while melting. For use in dipping bon-bons, Fondant should never be placed in direct contact with range. It should be melted in a bowl or sauce-pan, placed inside another vessel containing boiling water. Fondant should be made at least 24 hours before using. If when melting fondant for dipping purposes it is too thick add a few drops of water cautiously. If fondant granulates on being beaten it has passed the soft ball stage. Reboil it with the original amount of water. Be careful to allow mixtures to sufficiently cool before heating and kneading. Fondant should be covered closely. Dry bon-bons and dipped confections on waxed paper.

**RECIPTS**  
FONDANT—Method No. 1, 2½ cups sugar, ¼ teaspoonful cream of tartar, ½ cup hot water, ½ teaspoonful Glycerine.  
Place ingredients in a smooth granite sauce pan. Stir until sugar is dissolved, no longer. Boil rapidly without stirring until, when tried in hot water, a soft ball may be formed that will first keep its shape. Place ingredients in a smooth granite sauce pan. Stir until sugar is dissolved no longer. Boil rapidly without stirring until when tried in cold water, a soft ball may be formed that will first keep its shape. This should be washed off with the hand, first dipped in cold water, or a wet piece of cheese cloth fastened over the end of a fork or clothes pin will answer the purpose. When soft ball is formed, pour mixture on to an oiled marble slab or greased platter. Let stand a few minutes undisturbed to cool, but not long enough to allow the mixture to become brittle around the edges. Scrape fondant with knife to one end of marble or platter, and work with a wooden paddle or spatula until white and creamy. It will quickly change from this consistency and begin to lump, when it should be kneaded with the hands until perfectly smooth. Put into a bowl, cover with oiled paper, to exclude air, that crust may not form on top and let stand twenty or thirty hours. Always make fondant on a clear day, as a damp heavy atmosphere has an unfavorable effect on the boiling of sugar. Nothing it to chance its name to that.
