Mr. A.E. McLean On Amendments To Banking Bill

Prince Co. Member Still Apparently Uncertain Which Way To Vote On Important Legislation.

The attitude of Mr. A. E. McLean, Liberal M. P., for Prince, on the Dominion Marketing Bill was thus expressed in Parliament as reported in Hansard of May 9. Mr. McLean: I have one or two questions to ask the minister before we leave this clause. So far I have taken no part in this discussion and it appears that a certain section of the press in my own province is sitting up nights and worrying because I have not taken a stand on the bill.
