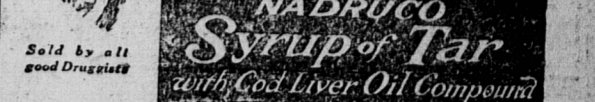
ST. MARGARETS NOTES.—The fishermen around here are busily engaged preparing for the coming season. The three companies operating at Naurage Harbor are offering very high prices for fish and no doubt the catch will be large if preparation and equipment are factors.—Mr. Leo Gillis who has been very ill with pneumonia is reported much better today. Dr. J. T. Sullivan is in attendance.—Mrs. R. D. McDonald who has been under treatment at the Charlottetown Hospital has returned home and although not as well as usual is much improved in health.—What might have been a serious accident occurred at the store of Mr. Mark Cheverie on Tuesday last when Mr. Frank McIsaac, Bear River was engaged in unloading a large drum of gas, at the warehouse, he slipped in some un-

accountable way and was hurled with great force against a rick stand, receiving besides a severe shaking up an ugly gash over the eye which bled profusely. 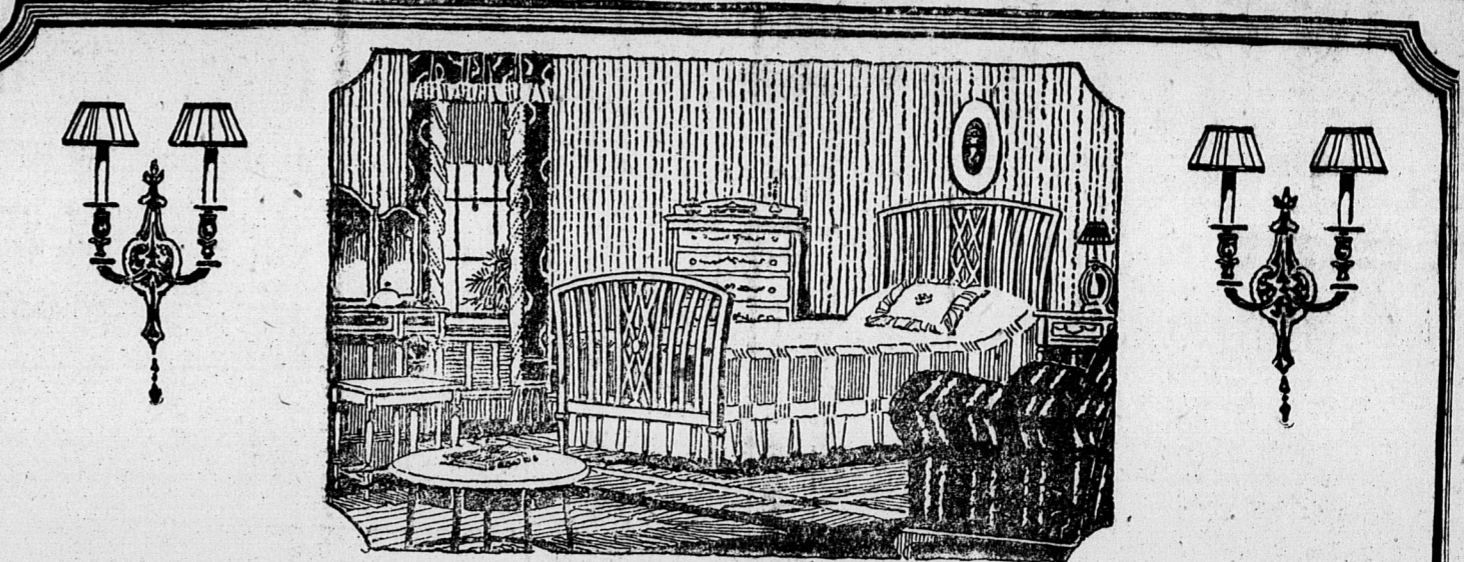
MISSIONARIES IN DANGER
Early in January cablegrams from China reported that Dr. A. L. Shelton, the famous medical missionary of Tibet, for the last fifteen years, had been captured and was being held for ransom by bandits near Yunnan. This is 400 miles from Batang and the doctor was accompanying Mrs. Shelton and their two daughters through the robber-infested region on their journey home. He was expected to return to Tibet and spend two more years before taking his furlough. Later cablegrams from the State Department at Washington indicate that the American Legation at Peking is doing all in its power for Dr. Shelton's release. Negotiations are slow on account of the great distance from Peking, the virtual independence and lawless condition of Yunnan province and the lack of means of communication. Mr. H. A. Baker, another of the Batang missionaries, who is now at home on furlough, says that in three trips through that section there was always robbing ahead or behind them, and that once his goods were saved by soldiers, Mrs. Shelton and the girls were safe and little anxiety is felt for the doctor. On the other hand those who know him best are picturing him working miracles of healing among his captors, preaching the gospel to them and in general making the best of the situation. It seems unfortunate that Dr. Shelton is prevented from his good work, among the Tibetans, for one of our own island boys Roderick McLeod who is a missionary on the same field with Dr. Shelton, says that the Tibetans are very sincere, and the change of heart they receive controls their conduct as it should in all our lives for a venerated life does not mean a christian life. Let us hope and pray that Dr. Shelton will soon be set free to return to his loved people.—T.
