Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, March 27—There is little news again this morning which might have an influence on the market. Eden's speech before the House of Commons yesterday was well received although it had very little influence on the London market today. Kennecott Copper 1935 reported \$1.32 against 53 cents in previous year. About the only important meeting scheduled for today is Corp. Products. As pointed out in yesterday afternoon's letter the market remained within range yesterday. The industrial average virtually advanced to the high of the year and backed away but this is quite normal action. It may take a piece of good news to carry the market into new high ground. The rails are several dollars away from the high of the year. Underdone of utilities would suggest that this group has a good chance.

NEW YORK, March 27—Brokers loans increased \$48,000,000. After establishing a good many highs in the morning trading yesterday, the market for the most part sold off to an extent in the afternoon. Evidently there is not the speculative following in the market at this time for stocks to carry through more than a day or so at a time. It also appeared yesterday as

though traders were the largest buyers of a good many of the stocks that were active in the morning. It is not likely that they were able to get out and consequently they may have more stock to sell. There is then a chance of a further sell-off before the market moves upward again. As a matter of fact, the trend of prices still seems upward, higher prices are quite likely to be accomplished in a very irregular way. A day or so of strength is likely to be followed by a setback but on the rallies quite a few issues should continue to make new highs. We believe the stocks we have been recommending are still a purchase on setbacks.

God's Lake—The President of God's Lake Gold Mines at the annual meeting painted a more optimistic picture. Mr. Jowsey said that while in the period covered by the annual report ore developments had been disappointing, on the lower levels since then there has been substantial improvement with corresponding betterment in the general outlook. Reference in this respect was made to the number seven ore shoot on the third level west which has now been opened for a length of 125 feet with the fact of the drift still in ore. The new ore shoot averaged 40 ounces across four feet.

TORONTO, March 27—Sellers made the concessions in the mining section of the Toronto exchange today and the scale down of prices resulted in a drop of about a point in both prices. Aggregate turnover of 707,000 shares was the smallest of the year for a full session. Most of the big golds moved slowly but Teck Hughes changed hands in volume with the price holding steady at 450. Wright Holdings, Bralorne, Lake Shore and Hollinger recorded minor losses and Pioneer finished unchanged. Central Patricia, Macassa and Read Authier were offered down 10 to 15 cents and only Central Patricia partly recovered. Macassa was off 15 cents at the close. Changes were of minor importance in the base metal and silver group. Noranda held to the 50 mark in good volume while Hudson Bay slipped 1-8 and losses up to 10 cents came out for Falconbridge, Mining Corporation, Sherbrooke, Sudbury Basin and Waltemole. A loss of 20 cents for Home Oil and 25 for Texas-Canadian were the main changes in the oils.
