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ALEXANDER SHAW PROMOTED TO RAILWAY SUPT. A Provincialist and a Brother to Neil Shaw, DeSable.

A recent issue of the Daily Eagle, issued at Pittsfield, Mass., contained the following comment on the change of management of their Electric Railway service.

"The first grand change in the management of the Pittsfield Electric Street railway comes in the naming of Alexander Shaw as general superintendent of the road. As superintendent of the Berkshire road, Mr. Shaw has always been an industrious, able and courteous official, although he has not been much in the public eye as the Berkshire road is patronized by but few people compared with the large number of citizens who patronize the Pittsfield lines. In his new position, or rather with his added duties, as he is to continue as superintendent of the Berkshire road, Mr. Shaw will be more conspicuous and no doubt all the same characteristics that have been a feature of his service with the Berkshire road will be seen in his new position. However, there will be more matters to see to and more difficulties to overcome from now on, but given the proper support there is no doubt Mr. Shaw will rise to the occasion.

Superintendent Shaw is one of the best known and most competent railway men in the commonwealth. He came to this city six years ago from Lynn. In those days Henry C. Page, now manager of the Worcester Street Railway company, was manager of the Berkshire company and it was through Mr. Page that Mr. Shaw entered the employ of the Berkshire company. In all the six years Mr. Shaw has served as superintendent. Mr. Shaw is 43 years of age and is married. His home is in East Street. It was 23 years ago that he entered

the railroad business. His first experiences was as conductor on a horse car in Lynn. He was later conductor of the same car after the line was electrified by the Thomson-Houston company. One of the first cars, it is noted, the first street car operated by electricity in this country was operated in Lynn. So Mr. Shaw is really a pioneer in the electric street railway operation. He has filled positions in practically all departments of the business.

During the next few weeks Mr. Shaw will spend much of his time at the office of the Pittsfield company. He feels that his presence there will be much needed in the carrying out of the reorganization policy affecting the Pittsfield system. There are many rumors today as to the probable shake-up among the employees of the line, but it will be a week probably before Mr. Shaw "gets his bearings," and decides upon a course of procedure as to employees. The force of about 130 men will be continued for the present. That some changes are contemplated is the impression in well informed circles."

Mr. Shaw above referred to is a native of this province, and a brother of Neil Shaw, DeSable. His numerous friends and relatives will be greatly pleased to learn of his success as a railway superintendent.
