TREAT CAR'S TOP WITH CARE

There's something about driving a car with the top down that few motorists can resist. There is no reason why anyone should try to resist it, but there are some things in connection with raising and

It is a job that requires care, particularly in the case of the older cars. It is quite important that motorists make certain the top material and the padding are not pinched between the bows or caught in such a way that they will chafe.

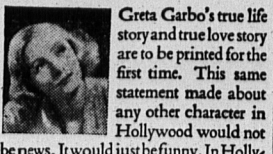

blades travel practically in a vacuum. The steam which keeps them moving travels at speeds only slightly higher, so that the relative speed between blade and steam is small. But even so, if there are impurities in the steam, or if water particles are present, the blades are subject to erosion and, in practice, this constitutes one of the serious problems.

This question of turbine blade erosion is one with which all power plant operators are concerned. In steam turbines the problem is to keep water away from the blades, but in hydraulic turbines we want to keep the water in contact with the blades as much as possible.

THE COOK'S CORNER

Shrimp Cocktail 1 1/2 cups flaked shrimps 1/4 cup Chili sauce Small can caviar 1 cup thin mayonnaise 1 tablespoon chopped ripe olives Mix Chili sauce, mayonnaise and olives. Put shrimp flakes into cocktail glasses and pour sauce over. Top with 1/2 teaspoon caviar.

Tomato Appetizer 1/4 thick slices of bread Sliced Spanish onion Salt and pepper Sliced tomato Powdered sugar Grated cheese Cut rounds of bread one-quarter inch thick and toast or saute. Over toast, place a very thin slice of Spanish onion, sprinkling with salt and pepper. Over the onion, put a thin slice of tomato, dredged lightly with salt, pepper and a very small sprinkle of powdered sugar. Cover tomato with a generous layer of grated cheese or rarebit mixture and set in a hot oven until cheese melts.

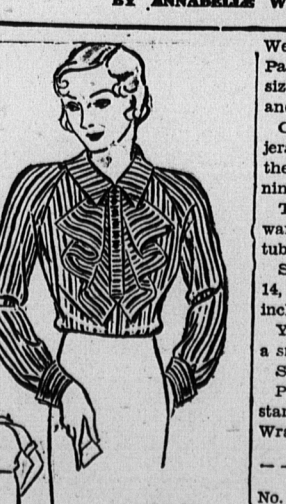
