Stronger in powers and other utilities were Brillian and Sigurnay preferred. Montreal Power was down and down and finished behind while Quebec lost an early gain. Always hard were Shawnegan, Ottawa Power, Bell Telephone B.C. Power "A" and Montreal Tramways. Metals appearing were all softer. Cons Metals Smelters and Hudson Bay Mining dropping small fractions while International Nickel advanced from the w to the less column. International Petroleum was harder in oils and Imperial gave ground.

WINNIPEG, Nov. 13—(CP)—Wheat futures closed 1-4—1-8 higher on Winnipeg grain exchange today with December at 73 3-8 cents, May 77 and July 78 1-2. Wheat prices averaged slightly higher for the session although trade continued light. A few mill purchases, southern buying and routine operations offset hedging pressure. Toronto Exchange

TORONTO, Nov. 13—(CP)—Gold stocks shook off some of their pessimism in the final hour today on the Toronto market and turned a loss into a 28 index gain. Base metal issues continued on the down side, mainly on the weakness of the senior issues, dropping 37 while the industrials and the western oils finished with insignificant losses. Table of a strike in the Kirkland Lake field was evidently a depressing factor in the early stage and the gold group index fell at noon to a new low for the year. Dome and Lake Shore touched new lows, but they recovered before the close. Final prices found McIntyre off 1-4 to 45 and Buffalo-Ankerite, Coniaraum, Canadian Malartic, Lamaque, Macassa, O'Brien, Powell Rouyn weakened 3 to 10 cents. The close was up a few cents for Little Long Lac, Malartic Gold Fields, Preston, Sylvanite and Wright-Hargreaves. Nickel was offered in sizable volume and the price touched 32 before tightening to 32 1-4 to close 3-8 down for the day. Hudson Bay and Smelters 7 weakened small fractions. Waste-Amulet selling ex-dividend, was off 30 cents to 450. Steep Rock held to the up side, advancing 7 cents to 175. Gains of a point or more were noted by Dominion Bank and Bank of Nova Scotia and fractions by Brewsters and Distillers, B.C. Power A, Canada Cement pfd, Canada Steamships, Gypsum and National Steel Co. Home Oil, H. Greenwood-Barce and Calmont were western oil gainers.
