Bishop of London
Plays Tennis Match

Roosevelt and Cooley Versus Ingram
and Garfield—Game Was Played in
Great Secrecy—Bishop and
President Were Captains
of Their Teams.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30.—A notable ath-
letic event took place at the White House
yesterday when by special invitation of
the President the right Rev. Arthur Foley
Winnington Ingram, Lord Bishop of Lon-
don, joined in a game of tennis with Mr.
Roosevelt, Secretary Garfield and Asst-
ant Secretary Cooley. Messrs. Garfield and
Cooley have long been members of the
famous tennis cabinet. The Bishop had
Secretary Garfield as partner and the Pres-
ident and Mr. Cooley were the opponents.
The game was kept a secret for several
hours, the contestants approaching the
tennis court from the White House proper,
and no visitors being admitted to
Secretary Loeb's office after four o'clock,
as the windows of Mr. Loeb's office over-
look the tennis court.
The court is hidden from the view of
passers by the street by a high screen
of painted canvas and there is no access
to the grounds South of the White House.
The only spectator was Silas McBee,
editor of the Churchman, who with the
Lord Bishop, is a house guest of the Pres-
ident. The aim and object of the match
was to determine whether the side cap-
tured by the President or the distinguish-
ed private should win at least two sets
out of three, and the play which began
shortly after four o'clock continued until
about six.
The outcome is not known, for all were
cautioned by the President to say nothing
about it, but it is certain that more than
two sets were played, so the presumption
is that the third set was necessary to de-
cide the contest. All the calculations are
that it, as the Lord Bishop would say,
was a tight match.
