COMMERCE EXPANDS. SHIPPING SHRINKS.

Canada was once relatively a great ship-building and ship-owning country. That was in a past generation and in the days of wooden ships. Today Canada presents the spectacle of a country whose over-sea commerce has advanced by leaps and bounds, beyond that of other prosperous countries, but whose shipping tonnage has fallen off in a most discouraging way.

In 1878 the shipping on the Canadian register totalled 1,383,000 tons, now reduced to 667,000 tons, or barely one half of what we once had. We are not now building one twentieth part as much tonnage as in the seventies of last century. Of course there are causes which partially account for the change. Steel has taken the place of wood in ship-building, and steam has superseded sails as a motive power. We cannot yet build steel steamers as cheaply as they are built in the Old Country.

But it must be admitted that the trial has not been made. The enormous development of manufacturing industry generally in Canada and of the iron and steel industry in particular, together with the development of railways and mining would go to show that great things might have been done if our captains of industry and our capitalists had turned their attention to the construction of ships. There would have been a loss at first, but a gain in the end. No doubt the decay of our shipping has been partly due to the fact that both our industry and capital have been occupied along so many other lines.

One is moved to ask why, seeing we did not build ships, we did not buy them and keep our mercantile fleet at full strength. We ought to be building our own ships, of which we need more than ever before. The industry would give employment to a vast number of skilled workmen. The earnings of our ships ought to form a source of large annual income. Instead we are paying heavy toll to British and foreign ships and sailors for carrying our products to the markets of the world. This is the one weakest point in our economic system. Whoever can devise a scheme that will restore our commercial marine and make it keep pace with our expanding commerce will be indeed a public benefactor.

Within a brief time past the British Admiralty has sold 500,000 tons of warships, some of which were not more than sixteen years old, and several having a speed as high as 19 knots. It was formerly the custom to repair and refit such ships, but it was found that they were not worth the cost. It is in fact almost impossible to modernize an old warship, and they are very rapidly.

Russian bonds have lately gone down almost to the low level of the dark days after the worst battles in the war with Japan.

Later he became what might be called an orthodox Liberal, then a Liberal Unionist, abandoning his Irish leanings, and he is now practically leader of the Conservative party.

Rev. Mr. Sedgewick of Zion Church has received a call to a wider field in Hamilton, Ont. The Presbyterians there have made a most judicious selection, but their brethren here, within and without the Presbyterian fold would be very sorry to have Mr. Sedgewick remove from our midst.

The Patriot makes the statement that the percentage of deaths from tuberculosis is larger in Prince Edward Island than in any other Province of Canada. We are not in a position to confirm or deny this statement. Many believe it true, but reliable statistics on which to base a judgment of any value are wanting. It seems undesirable that so sweeping and damaging a statement should be made when it is based upon a mere conjecture.

Among the great electric railway projects that have recently taken shape is one for an air line between New York and Chicago. The surveys are now in progress. The shortest steam railway between the two cities is 912 miles. The electric air line will be not more than 750 miles, a saving of 160 miles. It is believed that the new line will carry passengers for \$10 each, effecting for them a saving of ten hours in time and \$10 in money, and of course, capturing the cream of the passenger traffic.

We are told that five men were recently discharged from the railway shops in this city, and that enough work has since come in from Moncton to have kept them employed for three months. The burning of the shops here and in Moncton has created unusual conditions and difficulties and outsiders cannot form a judgment of much value on the matter of employing or discharging men under such exceptional circumstances. It is however, alike in the interest of the Railway and the city that when there is work to be done as many capable and efficient men shall be kept at work as can be profitably employed.

P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association Examinations

The board of examiners of the P. E. Island Pharmaceutical Association will meet for the purpose of examining candidates offering for registration on July 30, 1906. Every candidate for examination shall satisfy the council that he has served as assistant in a drug store for not less than four years and at least two of these years has been employed in the dispensing of prescriptions.

Candidates must give notice to the Secretary-Registrar in writing, of their intention to present themselves for examination at least fifteen days before the date fixed for the examination. Such notice must be accompanied by examination fee of \$5.00, and by certificate to the satisfaction of the Council that the candidate possesses the qualifications above described. Any person entering his name and place fixed for the examinations shall forfeit his fee to the Association.
