Paul's Flying School EX-R.C.A.F. PILOT PIONEERS P. E. I. FLYING SERVICE



Prince Edward Island's first flying service, begun in May last year by ex-R.C.A.F. Flight Lieutenant Paul Sharpe of Toronto, with one used Taylor craft, now features an air ambulance, a feeder service to Maritime Central Airways, sight-seeing flights for tourists and a school for pilots with an enrollment of 25 active students, such as district farmer, Elton Woodside (extreme upper left) receiving instruction from Paul Sharpe. Being shown emergency starting procedure by veteran R. C. A. F. pilot instructor Len MacDonald of Montreal, is local student, Keith Champion (extreme upper right).
