### ADVERSE TRADE CONDITIONS

The Canadian dollar is still selling at a discount and the reason is not far to seek. According to statistics recently published we are buying from the United States at the rate of a billion dollars a year and selling them at the rate of half a billion. The farmer or the merchant who buys double what he can sell knows that under such a system of trading only one of two results is possible, reform or bankruptcy.

For the twelve months ending last November our total imports increased by 425 millions, while our exports increased by only 38 millions.

Our imports from Great Britain increased by nearly 300 millions, whereas our exports to Great Britain fell off by about 40 per cent.

Our whole international trade shows a very large adverse balance.

In plain English this means bankruptcy if persisted in. Our trade with the United States has assumed the proportions of a national crime and a remedy must be found for it. The only remedy is to stop it. If an average duty of 29 per cent, reinforced by a fifteen per cent adverse exchange cannot stop it, then the duty on some imports at least should be so increased as to curtail their importation. This is not a question of discriminating against American goods, it is a question of saving Canada.

### "REASON TOGETHER"

During the last days of the year just closed the Patriot sent out a S O S call for a truce. "Come and let us reason together", said the organ of the Bell government when it could no longer endure the missiles flying at it from all directions. Is not this what the people of the province have been trying to do during the past summer? Only a week or so ago a meeting was called in Glen William, Kings County, for this very purpose. The two representatives of the Murray Harbour District were invited to "Come and reason together" with the electors but they declined. Several other meetings were held throughout the province when the representatives were given the opportunity of coming and reasoning with the electors but they wouldn't. This is why the people have been "reasoning" among themselves and have come to the conclusion that the only reasonable thing to do is to insist upon the resignation of the government as it refuses to do so on invitation.

If the Patriot also were to adopt the silent attitude of the representatives it would probably be better for the party as the excuses and explanations it offers are only aggravating those whom it tries to soothe. The people declare they have lost confidence in the government, not only because of incompetence but because it has violated every promise it made before the election. The Patriot tells them they do not know what they are talking about; that there is nothing whatever to complain about. Now, what is the use of "reasoning together" with the Patriot? It is bound to excuse the government; the people are bound to accuse it.

Does the Patriot expect men to "come and reason together" who are billed within a few months with three years taxes, for instance? The taxes of 1919 and 1920 have been paid within the past month; the taxes of 1921 are due shortly--taxes which the government candidates, when seeking election, declared would be reduced and which, immediately after election, they more than doubled. Is the Patriot ready to "reason together" with those whom it helped to deceive before the election? With those who, it now declares, are satisfied and contented although passing resolutions demanding the resignation of the government?

"Come and let us reason together" would be a good policy if it were not too late. However, the opportunity to try reasoning is always open and the government might try it in a body even if individually they are afraid to risk it. Confession, repentance and restitution are the preliminaries to "conferring together" and the government, at least through its organ, has shown no symptoms of any of these.

### CURRENT COMMENT

Not within the present century have our Conservatives had an up-to-date and perfect working organization. We have dependent almost invariably upon spasmodic gatherings together, generally close on the eve of an election, everything conducted in the haste of emergency, and as a result of these topsy-turvy methods very little has been efficiently done, bringing about too often unnecessary and undesired defeat. At each of these partial organizations resolves have been entered into to give permanence to a system, but apart from the election of officials and a briefly outlined resolution program, the resolve died in the initiative. We are not in for recrimination or blame of anybody. All are in the mix-up and all participants in the inactivity. It has been a case of everybody's business and that in the end means everybody's inactivity.

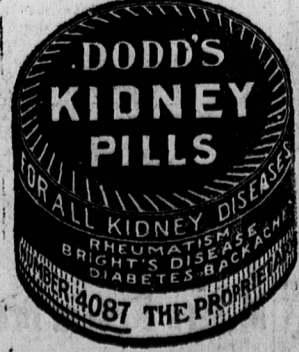
Much of this inactivity is due to the opinion that organization should originate with our elected representatives. While this, especially in a small community like ours, may be considered admissible, it does not accord with the correct principles of practical politics. These, instead of controlling, should be the mouth pieces of the popular force behind them, and the exponents of the platform and the policy of the sodality which they represent. In good taste it is the function of the people to select their standard-bearers place in their hands the mandate upon which they are to act, and to take upon themselves the responsibility of securing their triumphant return. It is the duty of the representative, not necessarily bound in minor matters or small details, to adhere to that mandate. When his conscience requires, or his cupidities suggests a contrary course, it then becomes his honorable duty to return his trust to those who elected him, and resign his seat.

Recent election campaigns have established the fact that we have many grand men and heroic workers in our Conservative ranks, public spirited citizens whose personal sacrifice and devotion to the best interest of the country are an honor and credit to the party. Such men properly organized, under a system in which the labors of the campaign would be fairly divided, each having his allotted task, and no half dozen of the willing stalwarts expected to carry the whole burden, are of the class who have a right to expect success from the beginning. There is no "one horse" created, no matter how excellent his nerve or elastic his muscle, that can be depended upon to carry a party to victory, and there is no small group of workers, however efficient, who can successfully grapple with the multifarious requirements of an election campaign. But an organization, under the stimulus and direction of such men, and reaching out with its sub-branches to the furthest end of every poll in the Province, could enter the contest with the winning cards in their hands.

Nor should this organization stand purely and alone for Party aggrandizement or class exaltation. Its ambition and aim should be for that which will contribute most to the country's good. If, as we see it, the policy of the National Liberal and Conservative Party is the one best calculated to develop the resources of the country and to ensure the safest national destiny, then through all the mouth-pieces of our co-fraternity we should impress our views upon our neighbors and the thinking people of the country. A party combination should be ever upon the alert to educate the public mind and popularize the principles of sound government. This in the past has been largely left to the press, and whilst our newspapers have nobly done their part there is much that should be done by other and effective means.
