PLACES A HIGH ESTIMATE ON THE CANADIAN'S SERVICE AND VALOR

Lord Roberts Intends to Come to Canada Very Soon, Says Dr. Robert O. Pyne, Where He Has so Many Friends. He May Come to This Country By Way of New York But the Dominion of Canada is His Objective Point.

"When I shook hands with Lord Roberts on coming away, I remarked that I should not likely soon see him again, but he replied: 'I don't know about that, for I have promised so many of my military friends in Canada that I would endeavor to pay them a visit, and I will try to carry out my promise.'"

That is what Dr. R. A. Pyne, M. P. P., told the Mail and Empire Saturday of the report that Lord Roberts, commander-in-chief of the forces of the empire, would visit Canada shortly. Doctor Pyne is a cousin of Lord Roberts, his mother having been the sister of Sir Abraham Roberts, father of the hero of Kandahar and South Africa. Doctor Pyne has just returned from a trip to England and Ireland, and just before coming away he called on Lord Roberts at his house in London, when the conversation given above took place.

The Mail and Empire called attention to the fact that press despatches announced that Lord Roberts would shortly visit New York, and asked whether the commander-in-chief had intimated that

that occasion.

"It is Canada that he is going to visit," replied Doctor Pyne, "Canada is the country he wants to see, the country where he has so many friends. Lord Roberts is proud of Canadians for what they did in South Africa, and this is the country he wants to visit. He may come by way of New York, for no doubt he has many friends among the military men there but Canada is his objective point."

Doctor Pyne found Lord Roberts a very busy man, dividing up his time with the regularity of clockwork, so as to cover his numerous engagements. He carries his 70 years as jauntily as if they were 30, and his activity, his keen interest in everything that pertains to the empire, and his memory for faces and dates and places is simply marvelous.

At Lord Roberts' house Doctor Pyne met J. W. Forster, of Toronto, who was there to obtain sittings for the oil painting of the commander-in-chief, which he was doing for the Queen's Own Rifles—Toronto Mail and Empire.

KAISER MAY COME TO THE UNITED STATES

And Prince Henry Will Return. Says Commander Bebler.

BALTIMORE, Md., October 21.—"Prince Henry of Prussia is to make another visit to this country," said Commander William H. Bebler, of the United States Navy, former naval attaché at Berlin, who is now at his home here. "There is also a likelihood that the Emperor himself will come here; but of this I am not so certain," continued the commander. "Emperor William is so interested in America and Americans that he is anxious to make the journey, and if things can be arranged he will come."

"Prince Henry's visit will be made with a view to sight-seeing, and especially to go on a hunting expedition with President Roosevelt. It will be some time before he will be able to come, because he is compelled to serve out his term of active service in the navy before he will be free to go on another jaunt. The general anxiety to see America is shared by other members of the German Royal family, one of whom the Princess Leopold, sister-in-law of the Emperor is especially anxious to come here."
