Carrie Nation is dead and gone and being dead she yet speaketh. Few women of her station of life have, in passing from earth received so wide and generally favorable notice in the newspaper press. It will be remarked that she visited Charlottetown and various parts of Canada in the course of her lecturing tour, and here and there did some "smashing" in a limited measure. Her lecturing tours extended through the United States also, but it was in her home state of Kansas that her most effective work was done.

THE HEATED TERM.

The recent heated term which was experienced throughout New York, New England and Ontario in especial severity, is said to have proved fatal to at least five hundred persons. Toronto alone had in three days forty-four deaths from the heat. Such fatality from the weather is unknown in Prince Edward Island and almost entirely unknown in the Maritime Provinces. And either Toronto or Montreal, especially the two latter cities, have much lower extremes of cold in winter than we have here.

It would not be hampered by hoary rules of practice and procedure, nor delayed by any admiration for the traditions of the kindergarten age of commerce."

MR. BORDEN FINISHES TOUR OF THE WEST

WINNIPEG, July 10.—Mr. Borden finished his tour of the three prairie provinces on Saturday night with meetings at London and Somerset. The tour lasted eighteen days. During that period the Opposition Leader addressed thirty-eight set meetings. The total territory covered in the provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta was 32,000 miles. The tour creates a new record in respect to the territory covered, and in the number of meetings held.

WILD CATTERS AT WORK AGAIN.

Grand Trunk Pacific Takes Legal Action Against Private Companies Using its Name. WINNIPEG, July 8.—The Grand Trunk Pacific has issued formal warning against real estate men who are offering in the name of the railway company to sell lots in bogus townsites along its lines in the Western Provinces, and has given notice that all such people will be prosecuted in the courts. D'Arcy Tate, solicitor for the company, states that actions are now pending in the courts against six or seven concerns that are using the company's name, and that all wild-catters will be brought to justice in an endeavor to prevent the repetitions of such misadventures as have already occurred in a number of cases.
